AN ORDINANCE INCORPORATING PORTIONS OF QUARTER SECTIONS 53 AND 78, RANCHO DE LA NACION, MAP NO. 166, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, INTO R-1-5 ZONE, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 101.0407 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 4482 (NEW SERIES), ADOPTED AUGUST 1, 1950 AND ORDINANCE 4314 (NEW SERIES), ADOPTED FEBRUARY 14, 1950, OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO INSOFAR AS THE SAME CONFLICTS HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That in the event that within two years of the effective date of this ordinance portions of Quarter Sections 53 and 78, Rancho de la Nacion, Map No. 166, in the City of San Diego, California, designated "R-1-5" on Zone Map Drawing No. B-3267, is subdivided and a map or maps thereof duly sumitted to the City and thereafter recorded, and within such subdivision or subdivisions provision is made for the installation of public utility services and the dedication of streets, alleys and easements for public use, the provisions of Section 101.0407 shall attach and become applicable to the said subdivided land, and the said subdivided land shall be incorporated into R-1-5 Zone, as described and defined by Section 101.0407, the boundary of such zone to be as indicated on Zone Map Drawing No. B-3267, filed in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 767464. Said zoning shall attach only to those areas included in the map as provided in this section.

Section 2. That in the event the zoning restrictions shall attach to the said land described in Section 1 of this ordinance, Ordinance No. 4482 (New Series), adopted August 1, 1950 and Ordinance No. 4314 (New Series), adopted February 14, 1950, be, and it is hereby repealed insofar as it conflicts herewith.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage, and no building permits for development inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be issued unless application therefor was made prior to the date of adoption of this ordinance.
