AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION ON THE CA-ZONED PROPERTY IN THE AREA BOUNDED ON THE NORTH BY IMPERIAL AVENUE, ON THE WEST BY 61ST STREET, ON THE EAST BY 62ND STREET AND THE CITY LIMITS ON THE SOUTH, IN THE SOUTHEAST COMMUNITY PLAN, AND ALSO THAT CA-ZONED PROPERTY WITHIN THE SOUTH BAY TERRACES SKYLINE/PARADISE HILLS PLANNING AREA FOR A PERIOD ENDING APRIL 15, 1981.

WHEREAS, the adopted plans for the area bounded on the north by Imperial Avenue, to the west by 61st Street, 62nd Street to the east and south by the City boundaries and the South Bay Terraces Skyline/Paradise Hills Community Planning Area include areas planned for commercial use and zoned CA; and

WHEREAS, there has been a lack of commercial development in these areas with an existing population of over 100,000 people and with projected population to exceed 160,000 people; and

WHEREAS, the CA Zone permits residential development as a part of the total development; and

WHEREAS, residential development has occurred on 15+ acres of land shown on the plan for commercial; and

WHEREAS, the further development of residential structures will preclude the necessary commercial development needed by the community and called for in the community plan; and

WHEREAS, the lack of commercial development will have detrimental effects in that:

1. Area residents will be deprived of nearby commercial support uses.

- 2. The existing commercial-zoned properties are threatened with residential development.
- 3. Area residents and the region will be impacted by a greater need to travel substantial distances for commercial activities and services.
- 4. There are no major commercial stores to service the needs of the community.
- 5. No other areas are available in the community to make up the loss if these commercial sites are permitted to develop with residential uses; and

WHEREAS, the foregoing effects will detrimentally affect the health, safety and general welfare of a significant portion of the citizens of The City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Municipal Code, Section 91.01, provide that the City Council can, by ordinance, prohibit any construction which would be detrimental to the health, safety and general welfare of The City of San Diego; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time, place and date of the public hearing on this ordinance was given in the SAN DIEGO DAILY TRANSCRIPT newspaper on December 4, 1980; and

WHEREAS, the publication was completed on December 4, 1980, a date more than five (5) days before the date on which this ordinance was considered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, a notice has been sent to all property owners affected by this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, in order to preserve the health, safety and general welfare this ordinance must become immediately effective as an emergency measure; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego finds from the evidence presented to it at the public hearing on December 15, 1980, that the facts recited above are true and the conclusions based thereon are reasonable, justified and compelled by the circumstances; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That within the areas designated "CA Zone" and shown on C Sheet Nos. C-662 and C-663, copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 768023, no building permits shall be issued by The City of San Diego for the construction of residential dwelling units after the introduction and adoption of the ordinance enacting these provisions.

The provisions of this ordinance shall be of no further force or effect on April 15, 1981.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective upon its introduction and adoption as an emergency measure based upon the facts related in the preamble to this ordinance.
