## RESOLUTION NO. $\Re -251066$

WHEREAS, construction of a Second International Border Crossing has been a subject of discussion among officials at all levels of government in both the United States and Mexico for the past seventeen years; and

WHEREAS, Otay Mesa has emerged as the favored site for such a Second International Border Crossing; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Council by a resolution adopted February 8, 1978, expressed its support for a Second International Border Crossing on Otay Mesa in the area of Harvest Road; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors by a resolution adopted December 13, 1977, expressed its support for a Second International Border Crossing on Otay Mesa and designated Harvest Road as the most suitable location; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Baja California,
Mexico, by letter to the Lt. Governor of the State of
California dated February 22, 1978, expressed the support of
the Mexican Government for a Second International Border
Crossing on Mesa De Otay at Harvest Road; and

WHEREAS, the State of Baja California has now refined its conceptual plans for the development of Mesa De Otay and desires a precise crossing location 600 meters east of Harvest Road; and

WHEREAS, said precise location at 600 meters east of Harvest Road is predicated on the ready availability of

land for right-of-way purposes and by traffic circulation considerations within the Mesa De Otay area; and

WHEREAS, based on presently available information, the United States General Services Administration, Customs Service, and Immigration and Naturalization Service have expressed no objection to said precise location at 600 meters east of Harvest Road; and

WHEREAS, said precise location at 600 meters east of
Harvest Road would result in only a minimal increase in costs
to the City and County of San Diego for access road construction; and

WHEREAS, said minimal increase in costs may be further mitigated by improved soil conditions on the revised route to said precise location; and

WHEREAS, agreement on said precise location at 600 meters east of Harvest Road would promote the mutual desires of the United States and Mexico for early construction of a Second International Border Crossing at Otay Mesa/Mesa De Otay; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- l. That The City of San Diego proclaims its continued support for a Second International Border Crossing on Otay Mesa.
- 2. That a precise location of 600 meters east of Harvest Road as favored by the Mexican government is acceptable to The City of San Diego.

3. That the San Diego County Board of Supervisors is urged to adopt a similar resolution of support.
