#### ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT CANDIDATE FINDINGS FOR BRIARWOOD VISTAS TENTATIVE MAP

The following candidate findings are recommended for the proposed Briarwood Vistas Tentative Map (EQD 76-09-49-S16). These findings have been prepared in accordance with Sections 15088 and 15089 of the California Administrative Code and Section 21081 of the California Public Resources Code.

# Geologic Constraints

#### Impacts

Soils conditions on site exhibit moderate shrink-swell behavior and moderate erosion hazards. These conditions could cause significant structural damage and erosion if the site is residentially developed.

#### Findings

The following alterations or changes have been incorporated into the project to mitigate the potentially significant effect of soils:

- ° A geologic and soils investigation of the site by a qualified engineer and adherance to the resulting recommendations;
- ° A storm drain system and brow ditch with velocity dissipator; and
- ° An erosion control landscape plan.

### Land Form and Visual Quality

#### Impacts

The project proposes terracing the site by grading approximately 65,000 cubic yards of material. Resulting artificial banks will not exceed 32 feet in height or 1.5 to 1 slope ratio. Grading of this magnitude is considered to be significant.

#### Findings

The following alterations or changes have been incorporated into the project to mitigate the effect of topographic alteration:

- ° Grading and the treatment of finished slopes in accordance with City standards and ordinances;
- A landscape plan to include punched-in straw, hydroseeding, container plants and selected irrigation.

#### Noise

#### Impacts

The project may be subjected to excessive noise emanating from Paradise Valley Road as traffic volumes increase in the future.

## Findings

The following alterations or changes have been incorporated into the project to mitigate the potentially significant effect of noise:

° A 5-foot-high masonry wall between Lots 1, 41, and 42 and Paradise Valley Road.
