A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY'S SUBMISSION TO THE UNITED STATES HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, AN URBAN DEVELOPMENT ACTION GRANT (UDAG) APPLICATION FOR FUNDS TO ASSIST IN ECONOMIC AND PHYSICAL REVITALIZATION AS IT RELATES TO THE COLUMBIA REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT -CONVENTION CENTER/HYATT HOTEL DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, a UDAG pre-application was transmitted to the State Clearinghouse and the Area-wide Clearinghouse (Comprehensive Planning Organization) pursuant to Section 570.455(d)(1), the Urban Development Action Grant Regulations;

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego is now submitting a formal grant application requesting \$10,500,000.00 in funds to be used to achieve physical and economic revitalization as it relates to the Columbia Redevelopment Project for the proposed convention center/Hyatt Hotel development; and



WHEREAS, a Master Environmental Impact Report (prepared pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended) was prepared and adopted for the Centre City Redevelopment Area, which included the Columbia Redevelopment Project area; and

WHEREAS, duly noticed public hearings were held for review of this formal UDAG application on June 6, 1980 and June 17, 1980 at which times all persons were given the opportunity to be heard:

URBAN DEVELOPMENT ACTION GRANT: COLUMBIA REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONVENTION CENTER/HYATT HOTEL

Development

Convention center/Hyatt Hotel - a 550,000 sq. ft. convention facility, a 1,000-room Hyatt Regency Hotel, and 1,500 parking spaces.



Proposed Financing

The convention center is proposed to be financed through the issuance of lease revenue bonds. The Redevelopment Agency will sell the bonds, design and build the center and lease it to the City of San Diego. The lease payment will be equal to the debt service on the bonds and will be funded in full with transient occupancy tax revenue, lease payments from the hotel developer, revenue from the public parking spaces and tax increments generated by the hotel.

The hotel portion of the public costs is proposed to be funded primarily with a \$10.5 million Urban Development Action Grant. The grant requires a 20% local match. It is proposed that the matching funds be committed through the sale of a \$1 million tax allocation note and \$2 million of Calendar 1981 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

A \$2.6 million CDBG allocation was previously approved by the City Council for both 1980 and 1981, for the repayment of a Section 108 loan for land acquisition in the Marina/Columbia residential project. It is proposed that the 1981 payment on the Section 108 loan be made on an "interest only" basis and that \$2 million of the 1981 Centre City allocation be diverted from Section 108 repayment to UDAG matching funds.



Action Grant regulations require ultimate repayment of the grant by the developer to the City. The future repayment is proposed to be utilized within the pocket of poverty area. Following is an itemization of the proposed budget.



The economic impact projections do not include any "multiplier effects" such as city-wide delegate spending or induced or indirect growth of convention-related activities.

Status of Development

The convention center/hotel site has been approved by the Redevelopment Agency/City Council. \$742,000 has been allocated by the City Council for the design of the convention center which is now in the schematic phase. A resolution of intent to sell up to \$250,000 of lease revenue bonds has been adopted by the City Council. Current projections call for a sale of the first issue (\$34.2 million for land assembly) in October, 1980. Subsequent to the acquisition of the site, construction is scheduled to begin on the convention center/Hyatt project in October, 1981. — to be completed in August, 1984.
