BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego as follows:

The Council hereby endorses the agreement between FRANK KONYN, KONYN DAIRY, and MICHAEL HORWATH, TMY FARMS, relating to the use of City-owned houses and wells in the SAN PASQUAL VALLEY, a copy of which agreement is attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.

AGREEMENT

This agreement dated August 27, 1980 is entered into by Michael Horwath, TMY Farms, and Frank Konyn, Konyn Dairy, in order to resolve the water, sewer and other related problems pretaining to the City-owned houses in San Pasqual Valley. Accordingly, both of the above parties agree to accept the terms of this agreement and to carry out their responsibilities as delineated below:

TMY

- 1. TMY will retain houses, Nos. 1, 2, 4, 6 & 7.
- 2. House No. 14 will be leased toTMY on a month-to-month basis with the stipulation that the City will not terminate the lease unless the house is required in connection with the proposed Farmer's Market.
- 3. Two wells located on the former Proctor leasehold,, one designated as well No. 12-S-1W-30Rl, and the other unnumbered, located at 15050 Old San Pasqual Road, will be turned over to TMY for the purpose of supplying potable water to houses, No. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7.
- 4. TMY will provide a back-up water supply system to all houses escept 13, for a period not to exceed 30 days in the event of an emergency. After 15 days during an emergency situation TMY has the right to interupt the water supply as necessary to water crops.
- 5. In the event the present litigation over ownership of well No. 13S-1W-5A2 is settled in favor of TMY and the City, TMY will continue to supply water to house No. 13 utilizing the existing waterlines.

FRANK KONYN

- 1. Konyn will retain houses Nos. 3,5, 9, 10, 11, 12 & 13.
- 2. TMY will allow Konyn to drill a well on the TMY lease-hold in close proximity to houses 9, 10, 11 & 12, to provide potable water.
- 5. In the event the above-mentioned well litigation is settled in favor of TMY and the City, the maintenance and electrical power costs for operating the well will be shared equally by Konyn and TMY. The electrical power costs to be shared will be computed only for the electrical connections to the well serving Konyn properties as of the date fo this agreement.

In addition to the above, the undersigned parties agree to provide plans for resolving the water and sewage problem related to the City-owned houses for which they are responsible, to the County Health Department by September 1, 1980, and further, to repair or replace defective septic tanks and to install and have operating properly the required water supply systems by October 1, 1980.

It is agreed and understood that the City of San Diego as owner of the subject property has a vested interest in said property. To the extent that any provision of this Agreement requires City approval, this Agreement is not binding on the City unless and until such approval is obtained or granted. In any event, the City's existing rights and obligations derived from the master leases between the City and TMY Farms, and the City and Frank Konyn, concerning the subject property are deemed unaltered by this Agreement.


