PROPOSED FINDING OF FACTS BY APPLICANT FOR SORRENTO ESTATES A LOT SUBDIVISION (TENTATIVE MAP 76-129)

1. The proposed map above-referenced is consistent with the General Plan and the Norty City West Community Plan which designates the property substantially more intense land use than the subdivision provides.

This is neither urban sprawl nor intense development, but merely the division of a large 23.3 acre parcel into six substantially large rural lots.

It does not violate the concept of phase development, but merely is a division of agricultural land into smaller agricultural properties.

- 2. The design and proposed improvements for the subdivision are consistent with the General Plan and North City West Community Plan and all zoning and development regulations. Specifically, the applicant is in conformance with the North City West Community Plan in that he has agreed to assist in bearing the cost of future school construction, as evidenced by the letter of the San Dieguito Union High School District (attached hereto as Exhibit "A,"), and his commitment to sign 1911 act waivers.
- 3. The site is physically suitable for residential development. The large lot sizes of two acres or more are consistent with the agricultural-rural nature of development in the area.

Water is available for domestic use, as evidenced by data supplied by Rancho Santa Fe Engineering Company.

- 4. The site is physically suitable for the proposed residential-rural density of development in that no zoning change is needed and five lots are two acres and above, and one is over twelve acres in size.
- 5. The design of the subdivision and the proposed improvements will not likely cause substantial environmental damage or substantially injure fish or wildlife or their habitat based upon the findings of the Environmental Report EQD No. 76-07-26P.
- 6. The design of the subdivision and the type of improvements will not likely cause serious public health problems inasmuch as the map is consistent with agricultural zoning and conforms with City development regulations.
- 7. The design of the subdivision and the type of improvements are such that it will not conflict with any easements, acquired by the public at large for access through or use of, property within the proposed subdivision.
