**FEE SCHEDULE AND REGULATIONS  
FOR USE OF CITY OF SAN DIEGO  
SANITARY LANDFILL DISPOSAL AREAS**

Section 66.0125 of the City of San Diego Municipal Code authorizes the City Manager to establish fees and regulations for the use of City Sanitary Landfill refuse disposal areas subject to the approval of the Council.

By Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_, 1981, the City Council established the following fee schedule for the use of City Sanitary Landfill Disposal areas effective July 1, 1981. (This supercedes the fee schedule of July 28, 1981.)

\*NOTE: This fee structure applies only to non-organic demolition materials generated in the City of San Diego, disposed of at the Montgomery Landfill. Any oversize materials are subject to special handling fees in addition to the vehicle charge.

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SPECIAL HANDLING FEE - ITEMS

Items in the following categories are subject to special fees as noted. If the item is in a mixed load, the fee will be in addition to the vehicle charge. If every item on a vehicle is subject to an individual charge, fees will be assessed on the item(s), and the vehicle charge will be waived.

B.	Any item more than 10 cu. ft. in volume; which due to its size, weight or other characteristics requires special handling or presents a safety or operational problem.	1.00/cu. ft.

SPECIAL HANDLING FEE - NON-HAZARDOUS INDUSTRIAL WASTES

Vehicles hauling non-hazardous industrial wastes shall be assessed the following fee. However, if the vehicle fee under Class I or II is greater, that fee shall apply.

Containerized solid industrial wastes (non-hazardous)	\$ .22/cu. ft.
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SPECIAL HANDLING FEE - SURCHARGE

Vehicles hauling the following categories of wastes are subject to a special handling surcharge in addition to the normal Class I or II fee for that vehicle

	<u>Surcharge Per Load</u>
A load consisting of more than 1,000 gal. of egg wastes kelp residue, food processing wastes, dewatered sewage, sludge or other similar semi-liquid material.	\$ 28.00
A load consisting of more than 15 cubic yards of straw or similar hard to handle material.	28.00
A load consisting of more than 10 cubic yards of tires, car seats, mattress springs, or other similar material.	28.00
A load consisting of more than 25% poles, pipes, tree trunks, logs, etc. longer than 10 ft. and/or more than 14 inches in diameter.	28.00

DELINQUENT FEES FOR DEFERRED PAYMENT ACCOUNTS

Processing fee for delinquent deferred payment accounts (i.e. accounts not paid in full within 15 days after invoice date).	\$ 15.00
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FEES APPLICABLE TO:

1. All vehicles hauling solid waste, any portion of which is generated outside the City limits.
2. All demolition, special handling and special surcharge handling type solid wastes generated within or outside the City limits
3. All vehicles hauling solid wastes operated by governmental entities, except the City, subject to exceptions authorized by Section 66.0126 of the Municipal Code.

FEE EXEMPTIONS FOR WASTES GENERATED WITHIN THE CITY:

No vehicle or special handling fee shall be applied for certain wastes generated within the City as follows:

1. Garbage and market refuse as defined in Section 66.0123 of the Municipal Code.
2. Dead animals less than 250 pounds.
3. Household ashes. (Ashes shall be wet. Dry ashes will not be accepted.)
4. Normal household waste.
5. Shrubbery and lawn trimmings not requiring special handling.

DEFINITIONS

1. For the purpose of this fee schedule, the following items shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them:
  - a. "Demolition materials" means materials or parts from new construction, wrecked or razed buildings or structures, and masonry and paving materials; demolition materials include but are not limited to broken concrete, asphalt, masonry, beams, poles, timbers, walls, roofs and plumbing lines and fixtures, or parts of any of them. (Dirt is a Class III material if a load contains more than 25% demolition materials.)
  - b. "Director" means General Services Director.
  - c. "Hazardous wastes" means any waste material or mixture of wastes which is toxic., corrosive, flammable, an irritant, a strong sensitizer, which generates pressure through decomposition, heat or other means, if such a waste or mixture of waste may cause substantial personal injury, serious illness or harm to humans, domestic animals, or wildlife, during or as an approximate result of any disposal of such wastes or mixture of wastes as defined in Article 2, Chapter 6.5, Section 25117 of the Health and Safety Code. The terms shall be given the same meaning as in the California Hazardous Substance Act (Chapter 13 commencing with Section 28740 of Division 21 of the Health and Safety Code).

- d. "Industrial wastes" means all types of solid and semi-solid wastes which result from industrial processes and manufacturing operations.
- e. "Liquid wastes" means waste materials which are not spadeable and must be loaded or unloaded through piping, tubing or hoses.
- f. "Medical wastes" means solid waste originating from health care (both human and animal) facilities: clinics, physician and dentist office.
- g. "Refuse collection vehicle" means any vehicle which is closed, leak-proof, self-unloading, and/or originally constructed for the purpose of solid waste collection and transport.
- h. "Solid wastes", "waste matter" and "City refuse" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid and semi-solid waste, such as refuse, garbage, rubbish, paper, ashes and industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles and parts thereof, discarded home and industrial appliances, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semi-solid wastes, and other discarded solid or semi-solid wastes; but excludes sewage collected and treated in a municipal or regional sewage system.
- i. "Solid waste facility" means a disposal facility, disposal site, and/or a solid waste transfer/processing station.

RULES, REGULATIONS AND SCHEDULE FOR COLLECTION OF FEES

- 1. A copy of the current Fee Schedule shall be conspicuously posted near the fee collector's station at each landfill. A copy of this regulation shall be maintained at each fee collection booth and shall be available for inspection during the hours the landfill is open to the public.
- 2. The Fee Schedule applies to all users of the landfill as follows:
  - a. Representatives of the State, County, a city, or any other governmental agency subject to exceptions authorized by Sections 66.0126 and 66.0127 of the San Diego Municipal Code.
  - b. General public when any portion of a load was generated outside the City of San Diego limits.
  - c. General public when the solid waste is classified demolition, industrial, special handling or special surcharge handling material, except that the Director is authorized to exempt payment of fees for solid waste generated within the City by nonprofit charitable organizations or as part of a civic group's nonprofit anti-litter clean-up campaign. Application for such exemption shall be made at least five days in advance of the campaign.
  - d. Upon application, the Director may exempt payment of fees for clean dirt and rip-rap subject to reasonable disposal conditions.

3. The following materials are not acceptable for disposal at City landfills:
  - a. Liquid wastes
  - b. Hazardous wastes
  - c. Infectious medical wastes
  - d. Solid industrial wastes required to be disposed of in sealed containers by state regulations.
4. The following materials, in addition to those listed in 3, above, are NOT ACCEPTABLE for disposal at Chollas landfill:
  - a. Medical wastes
  - b. Dewatered sewage sludge
  - c. Semi-solid materials such as kelp processing residue
  - d. Demolition materials, tree stumps or any other large or bulky items subject to the special handling surcharge.
  - e. Any material generating noxious odors.
5. Medical wastes: Any person hauling medical wastes for disposal in a City landfill shall notify the disposal fee collector that the load contains medical wastes and shall deposit the materials only at the specific location designated by the person in charge or control of the disposal operation.
6. Nothing in the above Fee Schedule shall be interpreted to supersede the provisions of Section 66.0124 of the San Diego Municipal Code in regulating the operations of sanitary fills.
7. Prior to the dumping of any garbage, rubbish, refuse or other type of solid waste, payment shall be made in accordance with the current Fee Schedule either in cash, by use of prepurchased tickets or by use of the deferred payment system.
8. The Solid Waste Division of the General Services Department shall maintain a fee collection program which will include record-keeping systems and provisions for payment of disposal fees by: (a) cash, (b) prepurchased tickets, or (c) a deferred payment system as prescribed by the City Auditor and Comptroller. The Director shall be responsible for the implementation and operation of the fee collection program and prior to permitting any solid waste to be deposited in City landfills shall require reasonable proof of the origin of the materials.
9. Deferred payment accounts are billed on a 28 day schedule with payment due within 15 working days of invoice date. A processing fee will be charged on all delinquent accounts.

10. At landfills where scales are in operation and where load factors have been established to the satisfaction of the Director, a charge per ton equivalent to the fees established herein may be levied.
