AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF COMPENSATION FOR THE MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 1982 THROUGH JUNE 30, 1984.

WHEREAS, Proposition E on the November 1973 ballot proposed an amendment to the Charter of The City of San Diego to add new sections providing for a Salary Setting Commission (herein called "Commission") and procedures for adjustments to salaries of the Mayor and Council; and

WHEREAS, the electorate of The City of San Diego approved Proposition E providing for such amendments to the Charter; and

WHEREAS, such amendments to the Charter were ratified by the Legislature of the State of California on December 7, 1973, pursuant to the requirements of Article XI, Section 5, of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Section 41.1 of the Charter established the Commission commencing January 1, 1974, and set forth therein the requirement that said Commission shall recommend to the Council the enactment of an ordinance establishing salaries for the Mayor and Council as provided by the Charter; and

WHEREAS, Section 12.1 pertaining to Councilmanic salaries and Section 24.1 pertaining to the Mayor's salary require that said Commission's recommendation be presented on or before February 15 of every even year, said salaries to be effective

the following July 1 for a two-year period; and

WHEREAS, the Commission conducted extensive research and held a series of public hearings to determine and ascertain facts sufficient to establish salary levels for recommendation to the Mayor and Council for adoption by ordinance as required by the Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Commission recognized, and in its deliberations considered, that the Mayor and Council members are entitled to and receive fringe benefits similar to those received by other City officers and employees; and

WHEREAS, the Commission, pursuant to the mandate of the Charter, presented its recommendations to the Council in public meeting on February 9, 1982; and

WHEREAS, the Commission recommended a two-step increase with an annual salary of \$36,625 for the Mayor and \$25,750 for each Council member to be established and incorporated in the fiscal 1983 salary ordinance and that \$42,000 for the Mayor and \$30,000 for each Council member to be established and incorporated in the fiscal year 1984 as the official compensation authorized for said elected officials; and

WHEREAS, the Council, by Resolutions Nos. 255802 and 255803, dated February 9, 1982, approved and adopted the recommendations of the Commission with the proviso that the second step recommended be returned to Council for further review and consideration prior to July 1, 1983; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to Section 41.1 of the Charter of The City of San Diego, the Report of the Salary Setting Commission to the Mayor and Council, dated February 9, 1982, attached hereto as Exhibit A and by this reference fully incorporated herein, as approved and adopted by Resolutions Nos. 255802 and 255803, dated February 9, 1982, is hereby further accepted and approved.

Section 2. That pursuant to Sections 24.1 and 12.1 of the Charter of The City of San Diego, and pursuant to the recommendations of the Commission, there is hereby established and adopted a schedule of compensation for the Mayor and Council members as follows:

- (a) First step effective July 1, 1982 through June 30, 1983:

  Mayor \$36,625 per annum

  Council Member \$25,750 per annum
- (b) Second step effective July 1, 1983 through June 30, 1984:

  Mayor \$42,000 per annum

  Council Member \$30,000 per annum

Section 3. The compensation schedule established by this ordinance shall be incorporated in the fiscal 1983 and 1984 salary ordinances of The City of San Diego and shall be effective for the periods July 1, 1982 through June 30, 1983 and July 1, 1983 through June 30, 1984.

Section 4. The compensation schedule established in Section 3 for fiscal year 1984, prior to promulgation and

incorporation in the fiscal 1984 salary ordinance, shall be returned to Council for further review and consideration.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

Re: Salary Recommendations for the positions of Mayor and Councilmembers (Council Docket Item No. 310)

Dear Mayor Wilson and Members of the Council:

In attempting to determine the recommendations for salary levels for the Mayor and Councilmembers of the City of San Diego for the period July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1984, the Salary Setting Commission sought to obtain as broad as public input as possible. To that end, the Commission conducted a series of public meetings widely announced in the local media, and to which the Commission extended invitations for their perspectives from present and recent Council incumbents and more than 200 individuals and organizations that relate to City operations.

In addition to the oral and written comments received as a result of these public hearings, the Commission reviewed the duties and responsibilities of the positions under consideration, the history of prior salary levels for these positions, the fringe benefits available and received by the Mayor and Councilmembers, and a wide scope of pay-scale data for elected and appointed municipal officials, both local and across the nation. In addition to these factors, the Commission reviewed the compensation of private sector professionals, cost of living increases in the San Diego area, overall impact of the economy, and the comparable relationship of the City Council job requirements with other similar types of positions.

The final recommendations by the Commission however, are based upon no single specific criterion, but rather reflect a consensus derived from the Commission's review and evaluation of all the above factors.

In conclusion, taking into consideration the comments received in public testimony, and having analyzed alternate perspectives and the wide scope of economic and statistical data available to this Commission, and in accordance with the requirements placed upon us by Sections 12.1, 24.1, and 41.1 of the City Charter, it is the determination and recommendation of the Salary Setting Commission that the annual salary for the Mayor should be established at \$36,625 effective July 1, 1982, with a second increase to \$42,000 effective July 1, 1983. For City Councilmembers, it is the recommendation of the Salary Setting Commission that the annual salary of \$25,750 should be implemented July 1, 1982, with a second increase to \$30,000 effective July 1, 1983.

We are pleased to submit our recommendations and urge you to incorporate it into the 1982-83 and 1983-84 Salary Ordinances. If you wish, we are available to answer any questions that you may have.

This ordinance is enacted pursuant to the provisions of Cherter Section 41.1 which requires the enactment of an ordinance establishing salaries for the Mayor and Council. The ordinance, following recommendations of the Salary Setting Commission, adopts a two-step increase with an annual salary of \$36,825 for the Mayor and \$25,750 for each Council member for fiscal year 1983 and \$42,000 for the Mayor and 330,000 for each Council member for fiscal year 1984 its provides, however, that the second step increase shall be returned to the Council for further review and consideration sufficiently in advance of its effective date July 1, 1983.
