RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO TO SUPPORT LEGISLATIVE EFFORTS TO POSTPONE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW ENERGY REGULATIONS FOR A TWO-YEAR PERIOD.

WHEREAS, in 1974, in response to rising energy prices and dwindling energy sources, the California Legislature created the California Energy Commission in an attempt to improve energy efficiency; and

WHEREAS, in 1977, the Commission adopted its first set of energy conservation standards for new residential buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Commission revised the energy standards for new residential buildings to be effective on July 13, 1982; and

WHEREAS, the enforcement of these new standards have been mandated by the State upon the City; and


WHEREAS, it has been requested that the City Council support legislation for a two-year delay in the implementation of the new standards, as did the City of Glendora, in its Resolution No. 82-20, dated March 9, 1982 (a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment A), for a variety of reasons as set forth in the report of the Director of Intergovernmental Relations to the Rules Committee, dated May 11, 1982; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council supports legislative efforts to postpone the effective date of implementation of the new energy regulations for a two-year period from July 13, 1982 to July 13, 1984.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be, and he is hereby directed to forward copies of this resolution to the San Diego area legislators in the State Legislature.

CITY OF GLENDORA RESOLUTION FOR TWO-YEAR DELAY

The City of Glendora endorsed a two-year delay of the California Energy Commission's new residential energy standards by a City Council resolution adopted March 9, 1982.

Rather than go through the agony of creating a new resolution for each city and county in California, supporters of the two-year delay are urged to encourage local governments to adopt a resolution endorsing the City of Glendora's resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 82-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENDORA, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, POSTPONING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW ENERGY REGULATIONS FOR JULY 13, 1982, TO JULY 13, 1984.

WHEREAS, the current high interest rate structure coupled with the cumulative effects of inflation have severely impacted negatively on the home building industry of California, and

WHEREAS, these factors have combined to substantially increase the cost of housing at a time when many California home seekers are already priced out of the housing market, and

WHEREAS, the Energy Building Regulations for new residential buildings adopted by the California Energy Commission are scheduled to go into effect on July 13, 1982, and

WHEREAS, these new regulations will add substantially to the cost of residential construction, and

WHEREAS, the implementation of the new energy standards will impose additional manpower requirements to cities and will result in increased costs to cities at a time when cities are faced with substantial fiscal constraints; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Glendora supports legislative efforts to postpone the effective date of implementation of the new energy regulations for July 13, 1982 to July 13, 1984; and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to our State Senator and State Assemblyman.
