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ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FINDINGS FOR THE MESA RIM INDUSTRIAL PARK PROJECT

The following findings are recommended relative to the conclusions of the environmental impact report (EIR) (EQD No. 81-11-15) for the proposed Mesa Rim Industrial Park project. These findings have been prepared pursuant to sections 15088 and 15089 of the California Administrative Code and to Section 21081 of the California Public Resources Code.

C. The decision-making body of the City of San Diego, having reviewed and considered the information contained in the EIR, finds that specific economic, social or other considerations make infeasible the mitigation measures or project alternatives identified in the EIR. Specifically:

Land Use/Visual Quality

Impacts to land use and visual quality would occur through project implementation. Construction of an industrial lot in the northeast corner of the site would conflict with the draft 1981 community plan which recommends a portion of that lot be developed as part of a community park. Because the draft 1981 community plan has not yet been adopted, the location of a park in that area is still in contention. Therefore, until adoption of the community plan, the significance of potential land use impacts cannot be determined. Upon adoption of a community plan, the project's potential land use impacts would be considered significant if the location of the community park remains as that recommmended in the 1981 draft community plan. The olive tree grove located on the lot in the northeast corner is regarded by the community as a visual resource; removal of the olive trees would result in significant impacts to visual quality.

Finding. The project has been designed in accordance with the 1981 draft community plan and, as presently designed, can accommodate a portion of the park site recommended by the community plan as it is presently designed. The 10-acre lot located in the northeast corner would have to be acquired through city purchase or by use of funds in the Facilities Benefit Assessment Program in order to allow implementation of a community park and preservation of the olive tree grove.

Mitigation of the project's potential impacts to land use/visual quality is also possible through implementation of the "No Project" Alternative or the "Reduced"
