

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FEE SCHEDULE AND REGULATIONS
FOR USE OF CITY OF SAN DIEGO
REFUSE DISPOSAL FACILITIES

AUTHORITY

Section 66.0123 and 66.0125 of the Municipal Code authorizes the City Manager to establish Refuse Disposal Fees and Regulations subject to Council approval.

By Resolution No. _____ on _____, 1982, the City Council established the following fee schedule for refuse disposal effective _____, 1982. This supercedes previous Fee Schedules and Regulations for Refuse Disposal.

*Note: Montgomery Landfill can only accept the following: earth, rock, concrete, asphalt paving, metal, clay products, and inert slags and tailings. Oversized demolition materials may also be subject to special handling fee.

SPECIAL HANDLING FEE

The following items are subject to special fees. If an item is in a mixed chargeable load, the special handling fee will be in addition to any applicable vehicle charge.

REGULATIONSFEE EXEMPTIONS

1. Fees shall not be charged for the disposal of refuse generated by single family or multi-family dwelling units located within the City limits. Proof may be required to verify the refuse's place of origin.
2. The Director is authorized to exempt payment of fees for refuse generated within the City by nonprofit charitable organizations or as part of a civic group's nonprofit antilitter clean-up campaign. Application for such exemption shall be made at least five days in advance of the campaign.
3. Upon application, the Director may exempt payment of fees for the disposal of rip-rap subject to reasonable disposal conditions. Dirt with less than 10% demolition materials will normally be fee exempt subject to reasonable disposal conditions.

FEES APPLICABLE

1. All vehicles disposing of refuse, any portion of which is generated outside the City limits, shall be subject to a fee.
2. All vehicles hauling commercial and/or industrial refuse generated within the City limits, shall be subject to a fee.
3. Governmental entities, except the City of San Diego, shall be charged a demolition fee and/or special handling surcharge subject to exceptions authorized by Municipal Code Sections 66.0126 and 66.0127.

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this fee schedule, the following items shall mean:

- A. "Commercial Wastes" include all types of solid and semi-solid waste material generated by stores, offices, hotels, motels and other commercial activities required under the provisions of the Municipal Code to pay a license tax, with the exception of all nontransient residential dwellings.
- B. "Demolition materials" means materials or parts from new construction, wrecked or razed buildings or structures, and masonry and paving materials; demolition materials include, but are not limited to broken concrete, asphalt, masonry, beams, poles, timbers, walls, roofs and plumbing lines and fixtures, or parts of any of them. A load of dirt containing more than 10% demolition materials will be charged an appropriate fee.

- C. "Director" means the General Services Director or a designated representative.
- D. "Disposal facilities" means a landfill, resource recovery plant, waste transfer / processing station or similar facility.
- E. "Hazardous wastes" the California Health and Safety Code defines hazardous wastes as:
- A waste, or combination of wastes, which because of its quantity, concentration, or physical, chemical, or infectious characteristics may either:
- (a) Cause, or significantly contribute to an increase in mortality or an increase in serious irreversible or incapacitating irreversible illness.
 - (b) Pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, or disposed of, or otherwise managed.
- F. "Industrial wastes" include all types of solid and semi-solid waste materials which result from industrial processes and manufacturing operations, excluding hazardous wastes.
- G. "Liquid wastes" means waste materials which are not spadeable and must be loaded or unloaded through piping, tubing or hoses.
- H. "Medical wastes" means solid waste originating from health care (both human and animal) facilities: clinics, physician and dentist office.
- I. "Refuse collection vehicle" means any vehicle which is closed, leakproof, self-unloading, and/or originally constructed for the purpose of solid waste collection and transport.
- J. "Wastes", "waste matter" and "refuse" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid and semi-solid waste, including but not limited to materials such as household refuse, garbage, rubbish, paper, ashes and industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles and parts thereof, discarded home and industrial appliances, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semi-solid wastes, and other discarded solid or semi-solid wastes; but excludes sewage collected and treated in a municipal or regional sewage system.
- K. "Residential wastes" include all types of solid and semi-solid waste materials generated by single family or multi-family dwelling units.
- L. "Clearing and grubbing" means the removal of vegetation by digging up roots and stumps for commercial development.

RULES, REGULATIONS AND SCHEDULE FOR COLLECTION OF FEES

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

The following materials are not acceptable for disposal at City landfills:

- a. Liquid wastes.

- b. Hazardous wastes.
- c. Infectious medical wastes.
- d. Solid industrial wastes required to be disposed of in sealed containers by Federal or State regulations.
- e. Dewatered sewage sludge.
- f. Any material generating noxious odors.
- g. Any material which cannot be safely or conveniently handled in the disposal operation.
- h. No explosives or highly inflammable materials shall be deposited.

OTHER REGULATIONS

- 1. A copy of the current Fee Schedule shall be conspicuously posted near the fee collector's station at each landfill. A copy of this regulation shall be maintained at each fee collection booth and be available for inspection during the hours the landfill is open to the public.
- 2. Any person hauling non-infectious medical wastes for disposal in a City landfill shall notify the Disposal Fee Collector that the load contains medical wastes and shall deposit the materials only at the specific location designated by a Disposal Supervisor or an authorized City employee.
- 3. Prior to the disposal of any chargeable refuse, payment shall be made in accordance with this Fee Schedule either in cash, by use of prepurchased tickets or by the deferred payment system.
- 4. The Solid Waste Division of the General Services Department shall maintain a fee collection program which will include record-keeping systems and provisions for payment of disposal fees by: (a) cash, (b) prepurchased tickets, or (c) a deferred payment system as prescribed by the City Auditor and Comptroller. The Director shall be responsible for the implementation and operation of the fee collection program and prior to permitting any refuse to be deposited in City refuse disposal facilities shall require reasonable proof of the origin of the materials.
- 5. No ashes shall be deposited unless they are thoroughly quenched.
- 6. Fires are prohibited in disposal areas.
- 7. Salvaging is prohibited in disposal areas except as specifically authorized by the City Manager.
- 8. Loitering is prohibited in disposal areas.
- 9. The special access roads serving the refuse disposal facilities shall not be used by the public except when necessary in the course of depositing waste in refuse disposal facilities.

10. The speed limit on refuse disposal facilities and on any special access roads there to shall be twenty (20) miles per hour.
11. No material shall be deposited in refuse disposal facilities except between the hours of 7:00 AM and 5:00 PM, Sundays and holidays included.
12. At refuse disposal facilities where scales are in operation and where load factors have been established to the satisfaction of the Director, a charge per ton equivalent to the fees established herein may be levied.
13. The basis of fees for refuse from outside the City limits, special handling and demolition materials are in Municipal Code Section 66.0125. For other fees see sub-section 14 of Municipal Code Section 66.0123.
14. Private Refuse Haulers licensed by the City of San Diego and disposing of refuse at City's Refuse Disposal Facilities, must maintain separate rate schedules for their City residential and non-residential customers. The rate schedule for non-residential customers must be higher than the residential rate schedule and the cost of non-residential refuse disposal cannot be passed along to their residential customers.
15. The Class I, "Fees Per City Vehicle" implements Proposition "F" fees by charging approximately 50% of the City's actual disposal cost per ton for all tons of non-demolition, City-generated refuse brought to City landfills, using the regionally accepted conversion factors of cubic yards to tons. A firm whose percentage of non-residential refuse varies more than 5% from the 50% standard rate would be required to demonstrate this fact to the City's satisfaction in order to receive an exception to pay the full cost per ton for disposal based on a lower percentage. The decision of the Director will be final. The Director shall have the authority to investigate any firm which the City has reason to believe is collecting and hauling more than 55% non-residential refuse to the City's refuse disposal facilities and to require payment of the full cost per ton for disposal based on a higher percentage. The decision of the Director will be final.
16. Any firm found in non-compliance with any provision of the Rules and Regulations resulting in lost revenue to the City will be penalized by requiring the refuse hauler to pay double the amount of lost revenue. Additional cost to the private refuse hauler resulting from this payment will not be passed along to any customer.
17. Nothing in this Fee Schedule shall be interpreted to supersede the provisions of Section 66.0124 of the San Diego Municipal Code in regulating the operations of refuse disposal facilities.
