BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City of San Diego hereby affirms its support of enterprise zone legislation that does not unduly penalize California cities, pursuant to the information and recommendation contained in the July 27, 1982 report of the

Director of the Intergovernmental Relations Department to the Rules Committee, entitled "Enterprise Zone Legislation."
