AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 7, DIVISION 21 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 27.2110 AND 27.2111 RELATING TO OBTAINING AND FILING NOMINATING PETITIONS IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 21 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending Sections 27.2110 and 27.2111 to read as follows:

SEC. 27.2110 OBTAINING AND CIRCULATING NOMINATING PETITIONS

Nominating petitions to be circulated in connection with candidacy in regular municipal primary elections held in the odd-numbered years may be obtained from the Clerk and circulated not earlier than eighty-eight days prior to the primary election.

Nominating petitions to be circulated in connection with candidacy in municipal primary elections that are consolidated with statewide primary elections held in the even-numbered years may be obtained from the Clerk and circulated not earlier than thirty (30) days prior to the date after which the Registrar of Voters shall not accept nomination documents for the direct primary election.

In the case of a special election called to fill a vacated elective office, nominating petitions may be obtained from the Clerk and circulated not earlier than sixty-seven days prior to the election; except that for special elections that would be consolidated with other statewide elections, Council shall adopt a schedule consistent with the filing of nomination documents for the statewide election.

SEC. 27.2111 FILING PETITIONS

Nominating petitions for candidacy in regular municipal primary elections held in the odd-numbered years shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk not earlier than the eighty-first day prior to the primary election nor later than the close of business on the sixtieth day prior to the primary election.

Nominating petitions for candidacy in municipal primary elections that are consolidated with statewide primary elections held in the even-numbered years shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk not earlier than twenty-two (22) days nor later than the day prior to the date after which the Registrar of Voters shall not accept nomination documents for the direct primary election.

In the case of a special election called to fill a vacated elective office, a nominating petition shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk no earlier than the sixtieth day prior to the primary election nor later than

the close of business on the fifty-third day prior to the primary election; except that for special elections that would be consolidated with other statewide elections, Council shall adopt a filing schedule consistent with the filing of nomination documents for statewide elections.

All petition sections shall be filed at the same time; no supplemental nominating petitions may be filed.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

except-that iIn the case of a special election called to fill a vacated elective office, the-time-shall-be-sixty-seven days nominating petitions may be obtained from the Clerk and circulated not earlier than sixty-seven days prior to the election; except that for special elections that would be consolidated with other statewide elections, Council shall adopt a schedule consistent with the filing of nomination documents for the statewide election.

SEC. 27.2111 FILING PETITIONS

Nominating petitions <u>for candidacy in regular municipal</u>

<u>primary elections held in the odd-numbered years</u> shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk not earlier than the eighty-first

day prior to the primary election nor later than the close of business on the sixtieth day prior to the primary election.

Nominating petitions for candidacy in municipal primary elections that are consolidated with statewide primary elections held in the even-numbered years shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk not earlier than twenty-two (22) days nor later than the day prior to the date after which the Registrar of Voters shall not accept nomination documents for the direct primary election.

except-that iIn the case of a special election called to fill a vacated elective office, a nominating petition shall be filed in the Office of the Clerk no earlier than the sixtieth day prior to the primary election nor later than the close of business on the fifty-third day prior to the primary election; except that for special elections that would be consolidated with other statewide elections, Council shall adopt a filing schedule consistent with the filing of nomination documents for statewide elections.

All petition sections shall be filed at the same time; no supplemental nominating petitions may be filed.
