Joint City/County Legislative Issues - Offshore Oil Drilling

BACKGROUND:

On February 7, 1983 the City Council endorsed the concept of the City and County of San Diego jointly pursuing legislative goals of mutual interest. Issues specifically identified include reform of tort liability law, allocation of hydroelectric power to San Diego, and antitrust immunity for local agencies. Subsequently, the matter of adequate staffing levels for the second border crossing was included as an area of joint effort.

In recent correspondence to the City Council, the Board of Supervisors requested the City to consider working together with the County on the issue of offshore oil drilling. Specifically, a joint effort on the following legislative policy is solicited:

- Oppose the inclusion of the nearshore area off the coast of San Diego in Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) lease sales until adequate environmental protection has been assured and until the need has been clearly demonstrated. Delete the nearshore area off San Diego from proposed lease sale No. 80.
- Support legislation which would increase state and local government's role in decision making on offshore operations which would have an impact onshore.

DISCUSSION:

Based on the recently approved City's Legislative Policy Guidelines and on Resolution #257659 (attached) adopted last December, offshore oil drilling is an issue in which the interests of the City and County coincide. We feel it would increase our mutual effectiveness and would be very useful to combine efforts with the County on this matter.

For your information, our first effort in this regard will be to support recently introduced S. 760 by Senator Cranston (R-Calif.) and H.R. 2059 by Congressman Panetta (D-Carmel Valley) that would restrict additional oil and gas

lease sales off both coasts until the end of the century. The bills are intended to block plans by Interior Secretary James Watt to solicit bids for oil drilling leases on hundreds of tracts off the coasts of California and Massachusetts, including a 12-mile wide strip along the coast of San Diego and Orange counties.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council and Board of Supervisors jointly endorse the legislative goals regarding offshore oil drilling as described in this report.
