

ORDINANCE NUMBER O-16097 (New Series)

Adopted on January 3, 1984

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 6, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 26.05 RELATING TO THE CREATION OF A SENIOR CITIZENS' ADVISORY BOARD.

WHEREAS, senior citizens constitute a significant segment of San Diego's population; and

WHEREAS, the decisions of City government frequently have a direct and unique effect on the lives of these citizens; and

WHEREAS, there is no formalized process or forum within City government for the seniors to advocate their views and make recommendations for legislative action; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a San Diego Senior Citizens' Advisory Board comprised of seniors representing each City Council district is necessary for timely, continuing, and effective liaison between seniors, their community, and their City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 6 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and is hereby amended by adding Section 26.05 to read as follows:

SEC. 26.05 SAN DIEGO SENIOR CITIZENS' ADVISORY BOARD

A. PURPOSE AND INTENT

It is the purpose and intent of the City Council to establish a Senior Citizens' Advisory Board to serve in an

advisory capacity to the Mayor, City Council, and City Manager on matters relating to senior citizens.

B. SENIOR CITIZENS' ADVISORY BOARD ESTABLISHED

There is hereby established a Senior Citizens' Advisory Board consisting of eleven (11) members who shall serve without compensation. The Board shall include one (1) representative from each Council District and three (3) members representing the City at large.

The members shall serve for a two-year term and each member shall serve until a successor is duly appointed and confirmed. The members shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council. The Mayor shall make such appointments pursuant to Council policy. The members shall be appointed in such a manner so that the terms of not more than six (6) members shall expire in any year. The expiration date of all terms shall be July 1. One member representing the City at large shall serve as Chairperson.

The Board shall meet not less than once every three (3) months and present a report to the Mayor and Council on a semi-annual basis. The Mayor shall appoint one member of the Council to serve as liaison to the Board and one other member of the Council as an alternate.

The Board shall adopt rules consistent with the law for the government of its business and procedures.

C. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS

The Senior Citizens' Advisory Board shall:

1. Develop a liaison network between senior citizens

and The City of San Diego, working particularly with and through The City of San Diego Senior Citizens' Section, with particular emphasis on legislative matters.

2. Initiate a review of current laws and procedures to determine if they are consistent with the needs and special concerns of San Diego's seniors.

3. Review existing networks and make recommendations for improving communication between seniors and City government both through formal organizations and on an individual basis.

4. Review appropriate City employment policies to encourage employment opportunities for seniors.

5. Encourage private sector development and utilization of skills banks creating opportunities for seniors to share their special expertise and experience on both a paid and voluntary basis.

6. Review and participate in the annual preparation and updating of the City's Housing Assistance Plan to ensure adequate assessment of and emphasis on seniors' housing requirements.

7. Perform other studies and surveys as may be requested by the Mayor, Council, or City Manager and provide information and advise thereon.

8. Serve as an advocate for senior citizens and advise the Mayor, City Council, and City Manager on relevant issues, and formulation of laws, policies, or procedures which may affect seniors.

9. Report annually to the Mayor and City Council on the "State of Senior Citizens" within The City of San Diego.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE 5 OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING AND REPEALING SECTIONS RELATED TO THE CREATION OF A SENIOR CITIZEN ADVISORY BOARD.

The Ordinance amends the San Diego Municipal Code to add a new section 9-5-02 creating a Senior Citizen's Advisory Board. The new advisory board is to consist of eleven (11) members, composed of (3) members from each Council District and (8) members from the City at large, is assigned the responsibility of making plans to assist citizens. To the end, they are to meet at least once every three (3) months and report to the Mayor and Council on a semi-annual basis. Various areas of concern to be addressed by the Board are specified in section 9-5-03.
