AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER VIII, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BE AMENDING SECTIONS 81.09, 82.07 AND 86.23 AND BY ADDING SECTION 86.09.06 RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter VIII, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Sections 81.09, 82.07 and 86.23 and by adding Section 86.09.06 to read as follows:

SEC. 81.09 POLICE PERSONNEL AUTHORIZED TO REMOVE VEHICLES FROM HIGHWAY

(a) Any regularly employed and salaried officer or employee of the Police Department of The City of San Diego is hereby authorized to remove a vehicle from a street or highway to the nearest garage or other place of safety, or to a garage designated or maintained by The City of San Diego, under the circumstances hereinafter enumerated:

(1) When any vehicle has been parked or left standing or stored upon a street or highway for seventy-two (72) or more consecutive hours.

(2) NO CHANGE.

(b) Any officers or employees removing a vehicle as provided herein shall comply with the procedures set forth in Section 22651 of the California Vehicle Code.

SEC. 82.07 PARKING VIOLATIONS

SEC. 86.09.06 PARKING IN EXCESS OF SEVENTY-TWO (72) HOURS PROHIBITED

No person shall park or cause to be parked or allow to remain standing any vehicle upon any street or highway in excess of seventy-two (72) consecutive hours.

SEC. 86.23 USE OF STREETS FOR STORAGE, SERVICE OR SALE OF VEHICLES OR FOR HABITATION PROHIBITED


(g) No person shall store or cause to be stored any vehicle upon any street. A vehicle shall be considered stored when it has been left standing on a street without having been moved more than one-tenth (1/10th) of a mile within a seventy-two (72) consecutive hour period.

(h) No person shall leave standing or cause or allow to be left standing any inoperable vehicle on any street for more than four (4) consecutive hours. A vehicle is considered to be inoperable when it is wrecked, burned, dismantled, or lacks a motor, transmission or wheel or

wheels, or is on blocks, or is otherwise incapable of being driven upon the highways in conformity with the requirements of the California Vehicle Code.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER VIII, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 81.09, 82.07 AND 82.23 AND BY ADDING SECTION 86.09.06 RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES.
Section 81.09 is amended to authorize non-sworn employees of the Police Department to tow vehicles as authorized by the California Vehicle Code, and authorizes towing of vehicles stored in excess of 72 hours, in addition to vehicles parked in excess of that time.
Section 82.07 is amended to add new fees for violations of parking in excess of 72 hours, storing vehicles on streets in excess of 72 hours, and parking inoperable vehicles on streets in excess of 4 hours.
Section 86.09.06 is added to prohibit parking in excess of 72 consecutive hours.
Section 82.23(g) is added to prohibit the storage of vehicles on streets in excess of 72 consecutive hours, and defines storage.
Section 82.23(h) is added to prohibit the parking of an inoperable vehicle, as defined, in excess of 4 hours.


