RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 260679

Adopted on MAY 14 1984

WHEREAS, the State Air Resources Board (ARB) consists of seven members appointed by the Governor with consent of the State Senate; and

WHEREAS, under existing law, three of the seven members shall be local elected officials who sit on local air pollution control districts and the other four members are non-elected persons who must meet specific qualifications; and

WHEREAS, of the three members representing local air pollution control districts, two shall represent the three largest districts in the State, i.e., the San Diego Air Pollution Control District; the South Coast (Los Angeles) Air Quality Management District; and the (San Francisco) Bay Area Air Quality Management District; and

WHEREAS, to provide equal opportunity for representation on the ARB by these three large districts, existing law provides a specific rotational process for selection among the three districts; and

WHEREAS, SB 1861 (McCorquodale) would delete the existing law provisions which guarantees the San Diego Air Pollution Control District representation on the ARB on a rotational basis with the Los Angeles and San Francisco districts; and

WHEREAS, in place of this rotational scheme among the three districts, SB 1861 (McCorquodale) would provide that the Los Angeles and San Francisco districts would each have permanent membership of the ARB; and

WHEREAS, on April 23, 1984, the Rules Committee reviewed the purpose and various aspects of SB 1861 (McCorquodale) relating to membership on the State Air Resources Board, as set forth in the Intergovernmental Relations Department Report No. 84-22, dated April 18, 1984, with the legislative analysis and recommendation attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, after review and discussion of said report and analysis, the Rules Committee voted unanimously to oppose SB 1861 (McCorquodale) for the reasons set forth in said legislative analysis; and

WHEREAS, the Rules Committee now forwards the matter of SB 1861 (McCorquodale) to the full Council with a unanimous recommendation to oppose; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, after full review of IRD Report No. 84-22, dated April 18, 1984, and the legislative analysis and recommendation attached thereto, does hereby express its opposition to SB 1861 (McCorquodale), relating to membership of the State Air Resources Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Intergovernmental Relations Department is hereby directed to take all necessary
