RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO PROVIDING FOR THE BORROWING OF FUNDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1984-1985 AND THE ISSUANCE OF 1984-85 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES THEREFOR.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 92 of the Charter of the City of San Diego (the "City"), this Council (the "Council") has found and determined that the sum not to exceed Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) is needed for the immediate requirements of the City to satisfy obligations payable from the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985, and that it is necessary that said sum be borrowed for such purpose at this time by the issuance of temporary notes therefor in anticipation of the receipt of property taxes and other taxes and revenues to be received by the City for the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985; and

WHEREAS, it appears, and the Council hereby finds and determines, that said sum not to exceed Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000), when added to the interest payable thereon, does not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total appropriations of the City for Fiscal Year 1984-1985 and is not in excess of eighty-five percent (85%) of the estimated amount of the uncollected property taxes and revenues of the City for

the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City which will be available in Fiscal Year 1984-1985 for the payment of said notes and the interest thereon; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 92 of the Charter of the City, property taxes and revenues which will be received by the City for the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985 can be pledged for the payment of said notes and the interest thereon (as hereinafter provided);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of The City of San Diego hereby finds, determines, declares and resolves as follows:

Section 1. All of the recitals herein set forth are true and correct, and the Council so finds and determines.

Section 2. Solely for the purpose of anticipating property taxes and other taxes and revenues to be received by the City for the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985, the City hereby determines to and shall borrow the aggregate principal sum not to exceed Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) by the issuance of temporary notes under Section 92 of the Charter of the City and Section 52850, et seq., of the Government Code of the State of California, designated "City of San Diego 1984 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes" (the "Notes"), to be numbered from 1 consecutively upward in order of issuance, to be in the denomination of \$25,000 or any multiple thereof, as specified by the successful purchaser thereof, to be dated July 2, 1984, to mature (without option of prior redemption) on June 28, 1985, and to bear interest, payable at maturity and computed on a 360-

day year basis, at the rate determined at the time of sale thereof, but not in excess of twelve percent (12%) per annum. Both the principal of and interest on the notes shall be payable, only upon surrender thereof, in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the City Treasurer of the City in San Diego, California, or at the option of the holder at the office of the Fiscal Agent of the City in New York, New York, or in San Francisco, Los Angeles or San Diego, California.

Section 3. The notes shall be issued without coupons and shall be substantially in the form and substance set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, the blanks in said form to be filled in with appropriate words and figures.

Section 4. The moneys so borrowed shall be deposited in the Tax Anticipation Note Revolving Fund of the City and used and expended by the City to satisfy obligations payable from the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985.

Section 5. The principal amount of the notes, together with the interest thereon, shall be payable from property taxes and other taxes and revenues which are received by the City for the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985. For the payment of the principal of and interest on the notes the City hereby pledges all uncollected property taxes and other taxes and revenues (as hereinafter provided) which are received by the City for the General Fund and the General Obligation Bond Fund

of the City during or allocable to Fiscal Year 1984-1985, and the principal of the notes and the interest thereon shall constitute a first lien and charge thereon and shall be payable from the first moneys received by the City from such pledged property taxes and revenues, and to the extent not so paid shall be paid from any other taxes of the City lawfully available therefor. In order to effect this pledge, the Council agrees that an amount equal to the principal and interest of the notes, not to exceed \$42,000,000 plus interest, shall be transferred to the accounts of the City in the Tax Anticipation Notes Revolving Fund, from the pledged revenue, such transfer being hereby authorized and approved. All pledged moneys so segregated in the Tax Anticipation Notes Revolving Fund shall not be used for any other purpose, and shall be held exclusively for, the payment of the principal of and interest on the notes; provided that such pledged moneys may be temporarily invested in authorized investments of City funds, with all interest earned thereon to be credited to the General Fund.

Section 6. The Treasurer of the City is hereby authorized to sign the notes, and the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to countersign the same by use of their facsimile signatures and to affix the seal of the City thereto by facsimile impression thereof, and said officers are hereby authorized to cause the blank spaces thereof to be filled in as may be appropriate.

Section 7. It is hereby convenanted and warranted by the Council that all representations and recitals contained in this resolution are true and correct, and that the City, and its

appropriate officials, have duly taken all proceedings necessary to be taken by them, and will take any additional proceedings necessary to be taken by them, for the levy, collection and enforcement of the property taxes pledged hereunder in accordance with law and for carrying out the provisions of this resolution.

Section 8. The Council, as issuer of the notes on behalf of the City, hereby covenants that it will make no use of the proceeds of the notes which would cause the notes to be "arbitrage bonds" under Section 103(c) of the Internal Revenue Code; and, to that end, so long as any of the notes are outstanding, the Council and all officers having custody or control of such proceeds shall comply with all requirements of said section and the regulations of the Untied States Department of the Treasury thereunder, to the extent that such requirements are, at the time, applicable and in effect, so that the notes will not be "arbitrage bonds."

Section 9. All the notes shall be offered for public sale on June 18, 1984, in accordance with the Notice of Note Sale attached hereto, labeled Exhibit B and by reference incorporated herein, which such notice shall be published once at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of sale in the Daily Transcript, and the Official Statement for the notes is hereby approved in substantially the form as shown on Document No. RR-260748 on file in the office of the City Clerk with such

changes as the City Manager and City Attorney find necessary, upon advice of Bond Counsel.
