

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 261840

ADOPTED ON OCT 29 1984

WHEREAS, the National Science Foundation has received funding from Congress in the amount of \$40 million in Fiscal Year 1985 to establish a national network of supercomputer centers; and

WHEREAS, General Atomic Technologies, Inc. has submitted a proposal to the National Science Foundation for the design, installation and management of a San Diego Supercomputer Center on the campus of the University of California at San Diego; and

WHEREAS, the members of the San Diego Supercomputer Center consortium encompass eighteen distinguished institutions located nationwide and include such San Diego scientific and educational centers as the Agouron Institute, the Salk Institute for Biological Studies, San Diego State University, Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation, the Southwest Fisheries Center, the University of California at San Diego and the UCSD Scripps Institution of Oceanography; and

WHEREAS, it is vitally important that the United States continue to produce scientists and engineers who have had experience with supercomputers and that California, which has contributed immeasurably to computer technology, participate in the expanding scientific and research use of supercomputers; and

WHEREAS, a supercomputer which can process close to one billion calculations a second can serve as many as 200 users simultaneously and thousands of users on an around-the-clock


basis can be ideally located on the University of California at San Diego campus, which is readily accessible to the scientific and educational centers of the nation; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a supercomputer center at the University of California at San Diego would assure that a maximum number of scientists and engineers will be allowed to expand their research activities at a nationally recognized university research center; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council does hereby offer to the San Diego Supercomputer Center consortium its unqualified support of its proposal and respectfully urges the National Science Foundation to grant the necessary approval and funding for the establishment of a supercomputer center on the campus of the University of California at San Diego.
