RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 262632

ADOPTED ON MAR 4 1985

WHEREAS, existing law requires the California Conservation Corps (CCC) to:

- 1. establish a non-residential program with a high school level educational component in neighborhoods with high concentrations of ethnic minority youths and high youth unemployment, and
- secure employment and training services for its members;

WHEREAS, the California Conservation Corps has the twofold function of:

- conserving and developing natural and public resources in both urban and rural areas, and
- providing youths with educational and work opportunities;

WHEREAS, until 1984, there was no particular requirement that the Corps target minority youths or high school dropouts, but in that year, legislation (SB 2049-Garamendi) was enacted directing the Corps to develop non-residential programs in neighborhoods with high concentrations of ethnic minorities and high unemployment, to recruit high school dropouts, and to provide an educational component that would lead to a high school diploma or its equivalent; and

WHEREAS, following enactment of SB 2049, the San Diego
Private Industry Council submitted to the CCC a proposal for
providing an employment training project for thirty minority San
Diego youths, consisting of a daily two-hour computerized
education component combined with eight hours of work experience
at work sites connected with Project First Class, the eastern
extension of the San Diego Trolley, and Barrio Logan but this
proposal was not approved by the CCC; and

WHEREAS, Senator Garamendi's proposed legislation (SB 104) seeks to remedy this situation by requiring that the non-residential programs be located in urban neighborhoods and by increasing the appropriation for the non-residential programs to \$12.3 million; and

WHEREAS, the background and discussion of SB 104 (Garamendi)
- CCC Programs for Urban Youth was set forth in Report No. 85-15
of the Intergovernmental Relations Department, dated February 6,
1985, for the information of the Rules Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Rules Committee, at its regularly scheduled meeting of February 11, 1985, considered and discussed the information and recommendation contained in IRD Report No. 85-15 regarding SB 104; and

WHEREAS, the Rules Committee approved said report and recommendation unanimously (5-0) and now forwards the matter to the full Council with a recommendation to support SB 104 (Garamendi); NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and behalf of The City of San Diego, does hereby declare and express its support for SB 104 (Garamendi) - "CCC Programs for Urban Youth," as set forth with discussion and recommendation in IRD Report No. 85-15, dated February 6, 1985.
