A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED AS THE JACKSON DRIVE (NAVAJO ROAD TO LAKE SHORE DRIVE) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. R-262682, a public hearing was called for on April 16, 1985, at the hour of 10:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Administration Building, 202 C Street, San Diego, California, to determine whether the public health, safety or general welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within that certain area of the City of San Diego more particularly described as follows:

Lots 14 and 15, Lake View Country Club Village Unit 1, Map 5204; the westerly 25 feet of Partition of Rancho Mission of San Diego, Map 330 SCC 348 between a line parallel to and 400 feet north of an extension of the northerly line of Lot 14, Lake View Country Club Village Unit 1, Map 5204, and a line parallel to and 500 feet north of an extension of the northerly line of Lot 14, Lake View Country Club Village Unit 1, Map 5204; Lots 1 through 20, Lake Shore Unit 1, Map 5051; the westerly 75 feet of Lot 399, Lake Shore Unit No. 5, Map 5178 between the southerly line of Lot 398, Lake Shore Unit No. 5, Map 5178 and a line 100 feet south of

the beginning of the southerly line of Lot 398, Lake Shore Unit No. 5, Map 5178, and parallel to northerly line of said lot.

Said district shall also include the following described public rights-of-way:

JACKSON DRIVE between a line parallel to and 50 feet south of the southerly line of Lake Shore Drive, and a line parallel to and 50 feet north of the northerly line of Navajo Road;

GOLFCREST DRIVE between a line parallel to and 50 feet north of the northerly line of Jackson Drive, and a line parallel to and 50 feet south of the southerly line of Jackson Drive;

NAVAJO ROAD between a line parallel to and 25 feet east of the easterly line of Jackson Drive, and the easterly line of Jackson Drive; all as more particularly shown on Drawing No. 21763-D entitled "JACKSON DRIVE (NAVAJO ROAD TO LAKE SHORE DRIVE) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT," copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 262682 and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

- The City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above-described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the maps and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.
- The City Council shall by subsequent resolution fix the date upon which the property in the district must be ready to receive underground service, and shall by subsequent resolution order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service.
- The City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this resolution within fifteen (15) days after the date of such adoption. Clerk shall further notify said affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code of the necessity that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar

or associated service they shall provide at their own expense all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California (as of the date of adoption of this resolution) and subject to all other applicable requirements of State law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.
