## CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR SAN DIEGO CONVENTION CENTER CORPORATION, INC.

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Adm. Code Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Adm. Code Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with the attached Appendix in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the San Diego Convention Center Corporation, Inc.

Pursuant to Section 4(A) of the standard Code, designated employees shall file statements of economic interests with their agencies. Upon receipt of the statements of the Board of Directors and Executive Vice President/General Manager, the agency shall make and retain a copy of and forward the original of these statements to the Clerk of the City of San Diego. All other originals and copies of the statements of the Board of Directors and Executive Vice President/General Manager shall be filed with the Secretary of the Board.

#### APPENDIX A

#### General Provisions

When a designated employee is required to disclose investments and sources of income, he need only disclose investments in business entities and sources of income which do business in the jurisdiction or have done business in the jurisdiction within the past two years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction. When a designated employee is required to disclose interests in real property, he need only disclose real property which is located in whole or in part within or not more than two miles outside the boundaries of the jurisdiction or within two miles of any land owned by the local government agency. (The boundaries of the Corporation a jurisdiction are depicted and described on Page A-4)

Designated employees shall disclose their financial interests pursuant to the appropriate disclosure category as indicated in the Chart on Page A-3.

With respect to Consultants, the Executive Vice

President may determine in writing that a particular consultant
is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope

and thus is not required to comply with the disclosure requirements described in these categories. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Vice President shall forward a copy of this determination to the Clerk of the City of San Diego.

Nothing herein excuses any such consultant from any other provision of this Conflict of Interest Code.
