A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED AS THE FIRST AVENUE (LAUREL STREET TO BROOKES AVENUE) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. R.264269, a public hearing was called for on November 26, 1985 at the hour of 10:00a.m.in the Council Chambers of the City Administration Building, 202 C Street, San Diego, California, to determine whether the public health, safety or general welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within that certain area of the City of San Diego more particularly described as follows:

Lots A through D in Block 287, lots L through H and the easterly 75 feet of lot G in Block 288, Lots G through J in Block 300, lots A through F in Block 301, lots C through F and the southerly 25 feet of lot B in Block 310, lots G through L in Block 311, lots A through D in Block 333, lots G through J and the southerly 25 feet of lot K in Block 334, lots G through L in Block 350, lots A through F in Block 351, lots D through F in Block 360, lots G through L in Block 361, lots G and H in Block 381, lots A through C and the westerly 50 feet of lot F, the westerly 50 feet of lot D in Block

382, lots C through E and the westerly 72 feet of lot F in Block 391, lots I through L in Block 392, the easterly 65 feet of Block 415, the westerly 100 feet of Block 416, all in HORTON'S ADDITION, Deed Book 13, Page 522; lots 1 and 2 in Block 9, lots 3 and 4 in Block 21 in LOMA GRANDE, Map 692; lot 16 and the easterly 50 feet of lot 15 in Block 12 in BROOKES ADDITION, Map 596.

Said district shall also include the following described public rights-of-way:

FIRST AVENUE between the northerly line of Laurel Street and a line parallel to and 200 feet north of the northerly line of Brookes Avenue; MAPLE STREET between a line parallel to and 100 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; NUTMEG STREET between a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue and the westerly line of First Avenue; PALM STREET between a line parallel to and 50 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 25 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; QUINCE STREET between a line parallel to and 25 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 60 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; REDWOOD STREET between a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue and the easterly line of First Avenue; SPRUCE STREET between a line parallel to and 75 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; THORN STREET between a line

parallel to and 50 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; UPAS STREET between a line parallel to and 50 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; WALNUT AVENUE between a line parallel to and 25 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 75 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; BROOKES STREET between a line parallel to and 50 feet west of the westerly line of First Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet east of the easterly line of First Avenue; all as more particularly shown on Drawing No. 22401-D entitled FIRST AVENUE (LAUREL STREET TO BROOKES AVENUE) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT, copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR.264269 and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

1. The City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require the removal of

poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above-described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the maps and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.

- 2. The City Council shall by subsequent resolution fix the date upon which the property in the district must be ready to receive underground service, and shall by subsequent resolution order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service.
- 3. The City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this resolution within fifteen (15) days after the date of such adoption. The City Clerk shall further notify said affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code of the necessity that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service they shall provide at their own expense all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive

underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California (as of the date of adoption of this resolution) and subject to all other applicable requirements of State law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.


