AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER X, ARTICLE 1, DIVISION 4, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 101.0405 RELATING TO THE OPEN SPACE ZONE.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter X, Article 1, Division 4, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding Section 101.0405 to read as follows:

## SEC. 101.0405 OPEN SPACE ZONE ("OS")

#### A. PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose of the "OS" Zone is to protect open space for the preservation of natural resources, for the managed production of the resources, for outdoor recreation and education, for public health and safety, for controlling urban form and design, and for scenic and visual enjoyment. This zone is intended to be applied to publicly owned parks, and private land where development rights have been transferred.

Within this zone, open space will be provided by limiting development in areas which are located, configured and possessed of physical features that may provide valuable and functional open space for the purposes of shaping urban form. The zone provides open space in the form of parks,

historic and cultural resources, and natural resources including but not limited to areas required for the preservation of plant and animal life, areas required for ecologic and other scientific study purposes, rivers, streams, bay and estuaries, and coastal branches, lakeshores, banks of rivers and streams, and watershed lands.

It is the intent of this legislation to apply this zone to public land indicated for open space and park purposes, and to private land where the application for the zone is requested by the property owner as part of a community plan identified density transfer program.

## B. SUBDISTRICT CLASSIFICATION APPLICATION

The "OS" Zone may be applied to properties which warrant the protection provided by this zone. The "OS" Zone may be applied to the following types of open space with the appropriate index:

OS-P

To be applied to all population-based parks and facilities including both neighborhood parks and facilities and community parks and recreation centers, as defined by the <a href="Progress Guide and General Plan">Progress Guide and General Plan</a>.

OS-R

To be applied to all resource-based parks as defined by the Progress Guide and General Plan such as sites of distinctive scenic, natural or cultural features intended for City-wide use.

OS-OSP

To be applied to all Open Space Parks defined as City-owned land acquired for the purpose of providing such benefits as scenic vistas, preservation of natural resources, and outdoor recreation potential. Lands within this classification are lands included within the City's Open Space inventory.

OS-TDR-(00DU) To be applied to private land where all or a portion of the development rights have been transferred to another site.

### C. PERMITTED USES

No structure or improvement or portion thereof shall be erected, converted, constructed, established, altered or enlarged, nor shall any premise be used, except for one or more of the following purposes:

# 1. OS-P, OS-R and OS-OSP.

- a. Parks.
- b. Recreation Centers.
- c. Community Centers.
- d. Facilities for park and recreation purposes.
- e. Public improvements including overhead and underground utilities. The placement of these facilities to be reviewed by the Planning Director for compatibility with individual Open Space plans.
- f. Any other use determined appropriate by the Planning Director.

## 2. OS-TDR.

Any use which does not denude, deface, grade or otherwise disturb in any manner at anytime the natural open space qualities of the site, except for the following uses:

a. Public improvements including overhead and underground public utilities. The placement of these facilities to be reviewed by the Planning

Director for compatibility with individual Open Space plans.

- b. Single family dwellings.
- D. PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

The following development regulations are intended to provide for the reasonable and orderly development of the City's open lands and to assure adequate levels of light, air and intensity of development, to maintain and enhance the locally recognized values of open space and to promote the safe and efficient circulation of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. The following regulations shall apply and are found necessary for the preservation of the community health, safety and general welfare:

- 1. OS-P, OS-R and OS-OSP.
- a. All development regulations including lot area, width and frontage; building setbacks, coverage, and height; and parking and landscaping standards shall be as determined appropriate by the City Manager and the Planning Director.
- 2. OS-TDR-(00DU).
  - Density Regulations.

Development rights on the lot or parcel area indicated in the parenthesis suffix and represent dwelling units. (Example: OS-TDR-(2DU) - two units total for subject property).

b. Property Development Regulations.

- (1) No minimum lot area, width, or frontage is required.
- (2) The minimum yard dimensions, floor area ratios, maximum building height and parking regulations shall be subject to the property development regulations of the R1-40000 Zone.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

Subclassifications of the zone are provided for land used for public parks, resource-based parks, open space parks and property which is subject to transfer of for each subclassification of the Open Space Zone.
