AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 7, DIVISION 22, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 27.2205; AMENDING DIVISION 32, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 27.3201, 27.3202, 27.3205 AND 27.3209, ALL RELATING TO BALLOTS AND WRITE-IN CANDIDATES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 22, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Section 27.2205 to read as follows:

### SEC. 27.2205 COUNTING OF WRITE-IN VOTES

To clarify the process for selection of candidates described in Section 10 of the Charter of The City of San Diego as modified by <u>Canaan v. Abdelnour</u>, 40 Cal.3d 703 (1986), the following shall apply:

Write-in candidates are permitted in all municipal elections and special elections. Any name written upon a municipal election or special election ballot, including a reasonable facsimile of the spelling of such name, shall be counted unless prohibited by Section 27.2205.1 of this Article, for the office for which it was written, if it is written in the blank space provided therefor.

Section 2. That Chapter II, Article 7, Division 32, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by amending

Sections 27.3201, 27.3202, 27.3205 and 27.3209 to read as follows:

# DIVISION 32 WRITE-IN CANDIDATES

### SEC. 27.3201 GENERAL PROVISIONS

Write-in candidates are permitted in municipal elections including special elections called by the City Council, pursuant to Section 27.2005 of this Article.

### SEC. 27.3202 NOMINATING PAPERS

Nominations of write-in candidates for elective offices shall be made by filing nominating papers including a declaration and affidavit of write-in candidacy in the office of the City Clerk on forms provided by the City Clerk. The form of the papers shall be substantially in the same form as set forth in Section 27.2103 of this Article except for a designation as a write-in candidate where appropriate and removal of the reference to a request that the candidate's name be printed upon the official ballot.

Nominating papers for municipal primary or recall elections may be obtained from the City Clerk no earlier than the first business day after the close of regular nominations for the primary, special or recall election.

Nominating papers for general municipal elections may be obtained from the City Clerk no earlier than the day following the primary election.

### SEC. 27.3205 FILING REQUIREMENTS

Every person who desires to be a write-in candidate and have his or her name written on the ballot of an election counted for a particular office shall:

- (a) File, on a form provided by the City Clerk a declaration and affidavit of write-in candidacy containing:
  - (1) the name of the candidate
  - (2) his or her current residence address
  - (3) a declaration stating that he or she is a write-in candidate
  - (4) the date of the election
  - (5) the office for which he or she is running
  - (6) his or her past residences for a period of four years
  - (7) date and place of birth
  - (8) his or her occupation, and
  - (9) a list of any previous public positions held in the City.
- (b) File a nomination paper, provided by the City Clerk, containing not less than 20 valid voter signatures. A signer of the nomination paper shall have been, at the time of signing, a registered voter for a period of not less than thirty (30) days in the district from which the candidate seeks nomination or election. No voter may sign more than one nomination paper for the same office, and in the event a voter does so, that voter's signature shall count only on the first nomination paper filed which contains the voter's

signature. Nomination papers subsequently filed which contain that voter's signature shall be considered as though the voter's signature does not appear thereon. Each seat on the governing body is a separate office. Any person registered to vote at the election may circulate a nomination paper.

(c) and (d) - No changes.

# SEC. 27.3209 TIME OF FILING NOMINATING PAPERS AND DECLARATION OF WRITE-IN CANDIDACY

The nominating papers and declaration of write-in candidacy shall be delivered to the City Clerk no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the election.

Section 3. Pursuant to Section 17 of the Charter of The City of San Diego, this ordinance shall take effect on the date of its adoption.

SEC. 27.2205 COUNTING OF WRITE-IN VOTES

To clarify the process for selection of candidates described in Section 10 of the Charter of The City of San Diego as modified by Canaan v. Abdelnour, 40 Cal.3d 703 (1986), the following shall apply:

Write-in candidates are permitted in all municipal primary elections and special primary elections. General municipal, special general or recall election ballots containing the name of any person not printed on the official ballot shall be counted as if the name added did not appear. Any name written upon a municipal primary election or special primary election ballot, including a reasonable facsimile of the spelling of such name, shall be counted unless prohibited by this Section or Section 27.2205.1 of this Article, for the office for which it was written, if it is written in the blank space provided therefor.

### SEC. 27.3201 GENERAL PROVISIONS

Write-in candidates are permitted in municipal primary elections including special primary elections called by the City Council, pursuant to Section 27-2402 27.2005 of this Article. 7 to fill a vacant elective office. No write-in candidates shall be permitted in general municipal, special general or recall elections.

### SEC. 27.3202 NOMINATING PAPERS

Nominations of write-in candidates for elective offices shall be made by filing nominating papers including a declaration and affidavit of write-in candidacy in the office of the City Clerk on forms provided by the City Clerk. The form of the papers shall be substantially in the same form as set forth in Section 27.2103 of this Article except for a designation as a write-in candidate where appropriate and removal of the reference to a request that the candidate's name be printed upon the official ballot.

Nominating papers for municipal primary or recall elections may be obtained from the City Clerk no earlier than the first business day after the close of regular nominations for the primary, special or recall election.

Nominating papers for general municipal elections may be obtained from the City Clerk no earlier than the day following the primary election.

## SEC. 27.3205 FILING REQUIREMENTS

SEC 27.3209 TIME OF FILING NOMINATING PAPERS AND DECLARATION OF WRITE-IN CANDIDACY

The nominating papers and declaration of write-in candidacy shall be delivered to the City Clerk no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the election. and no earlier than the first business day after the election of the election.
