ORDINANCE NUMBER O- 16640 (NEW SERIES)

ADOPTED ON MAY 13 1986

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 2,  
OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING  
DIVISION 22, SECTION 22.2201 AND 22.2202  
RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BINATIONAL  
AFFAIRS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 2, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding Division 22, Sections 22.2201 and 22.2202 to read as follows:

**DIVISION 22**

**DEPARTMENT OF BINATIONAL AFFAIRS**

**SEC. 22.2201 DEPARTMENT OF BINATIONAL AFFAIRS**

The Department of Binational Affairs is a City Department. The Director is the administrative head of the department and shall be appointed by and may be removed by the City Manager.

**SEC. 22.2202 POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIRECTOR OF BINATIONAL AFFAIRS**

The Director of Binational Affairs, under the direction of the City Manager, shall be responsible for the following duties and functions:

A. DUTIES:

The duties of the Department of Binational Affairs of The City of San Diego are:

(1) to establish a central point for coordination on issues that transcend the international border and which are indigenous to our border region, specifically to Tijuana and San Diego, and other cities in the San Diego region and in Baja California Norte and Baja California Sur;

(2) to serve as a catalyst in studying, analyzing, and making recommendations on existing concerns and other projects that may merit consideration for inclusion within its program;

(3) to enhance communication and administrative linkages between the state and federal governments on international aspects of local problems, and provide a focal point for the City's ongoing collaboration with federal, state, regional and local governments; private sector; educational institutions; and the San Diego/Tijuana community; and

(4) to maintain and improve communication and understanding between public and private sectors of both sides of the border.

B. FUNCTIONS

Supervisory

(1) To provide a continuous liaison between governmental entities to ensure collaboration on issues and projects between public and private institutions in the United States and Mexico.

(2) To advise and lend guidance to City Administration, policy makers, and other interested entities.

Coordination

(3) To facilitate the efforts of public and private entities to explore and understand the problems and opportunities that exist in our border regions.

(4) To conduct an inventory of existing binational efforts within the City, the County, educational and cultural institutions, and the business community; update and maintain files.

(5) To provide a referral system by networking with existing entities of a related nature.

(6) To coordinate efforts with the City's Select Board on Binational issues which will deal with issues of international concern.

Promotional

(7) To promote understanding towards the difference between the two systems of government's related differences in authority vested in the various levels of government; and each country's development, needs and priorities.

(8) To promote effective utilization of resources and information of both border regions.

(9) To have information generated become an integral part of The City of San Diego's archives and available for dissemination.

(10) To give visibility and promote the border area by the use of Tijuana and San Diego media, and community service programs.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
