AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 40, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 33.4002, 33.4005 AND 33.4008 AND BY REPEALING SECTION 33.4007 RELATING TO TOWING MOTOR VEHICLES FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter III, Article 3, Division 40, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Sections 33.4002, 33.4005 and 33.4008 and by repealing Section 33.4007 to read as follows:

SEC. 33.4002 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Division, the following definitions shall apply. Whenever any words or phrases are not defined herein, but are defined in the Vehicle Code of the State of California and the amendments thereto, such definitions are incorporated herein and shall be deemed to apply to such words and phrases as used herein as though set forth herein in full.

(a) "Business Enterprise" means a unit of economic organization or activity in the form of an individual natural person, sole proprietorship, corporation, partnership, organization, joint venture, trust, foundation, firm, group, society, association or any

combination thereof whose systematic purposeful activity includes the towing, removing and storing of parked vehicles from private property at the express instructions of the owners of such property.

- (b) No change.
- (c) "Removing" means to change by tow the location of a parked vehicle from its location on private property and to be in transit.
  - (d) No change.
- (e) "Towing" means to draw or pull along a vehicle by means of another vehicle equipped with booms, car carriers, winches or similar equipment as defined in California Vehicle Code Section 615(a).

SEC. 33.4005 RATES AND CHARGES

It shall be unlawful to:

(a) Charge fees to the registered owner or other authorized person in control of the vehicle for any services other than those reasonably related to the towing and storage of the vehicle including but not limited to fees for being allowed to retrieve personal property from the impounded vehicle or fees for releasing the vehicle during non-business hours if such release is between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday except for the holidays of New Year's Day, Presidents Day, Memorial Day (observed), Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Fees allowed pursuant to Section

22658(h) of the California Vehicle Code are exempt from these prohibitions.

SEC. 33.4008 REGULATIONS

It shall be unlawful to:

- (a) Tow or remove or store a vehicle except upon the express written authorization issued to the business enterprise by the property owner. Such authorization shall include the make, model, color and license plate number of the vehicle, the reason for the tow, and the legibly printed name of the property owner who is causing the removal of the vehicle. This authorization shall be signed by the property owner immediately prior to or at the time of towing.
- (b) Tow or remove or store a vehicle where the registered owner or other legally authorized person in control of the vehicle returns to the vehicle before it is removed from the private property.
  - (c) No change.
- (d) Tow or remove or store a vehicle unless the business enterprise notifies the San Diego Police

  Department immediately upon arrival at the garage. Such notification shall include the storage site, the date

and time in hours and minutes that the vehicle was towed or removed, the make, model, color, license plate number and vehicle identification number (V.I.N.) of the vehicle, the location from where the vehicle was removed, and the name of person giving written authorization for the removal of the vehicle. Further, the business enterprise shall obtain the name of the person at the San Diego Police Department to whom such information was reported and shall indicate that name as well as the above mentioned information on a record of the business enterprise.

- (e) No change.
- (f) Tow or remove or store a vehicle (1) unless notice pursuant to the requirements of Section 22658(a) of the California Vehicle Code is posted on the private property from which towing, removing or storing is made or (2) the lot or parcel upon which the vehicle is parked is improved with a single family dwelling.

  - (i) Violate any of the provisions of California Vehicle Code Sections 22658 and 22953.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
