RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 265085

ADOPTED ON FEB 18 1986

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO REQUESTING THE CONSOLIDATION OF A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON JUNE 3, 1986, WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE.

WHEREAS, at the meeting of the City Council held on FEB 18 1986, the Council indicated its intention to submit to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego one proposition relating to an initiative measure adding Section 130.1 to the Charter of The City of San Diego and one proposition relating to amending the Charter of The City of San Diego by amending Charter section 11.1 and adding Charter section 11.2, at a Special Municipal Election to be held in the City on June 3, 1986; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that this Special Municipal Election be consolidated with the Statewide Primary Election to be held on the same date and that within the City of San Diego the election precincts, polling places, voting booths and election officials for the two elections be the same, and that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego be authorized to canvass the returns of the Special Municipal Election and that this Special Municipal Election and the Statewide Primary Election be held in all respects as if there were only one election; and

WHEREAS, this Council within the time required by law has adopted an ordinance calling for a Special Municipal Election and

consolidating it with the Statewide Primary Election; NOW,
THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as
follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is
hereby requested to consolidate the Special Municipal Election to
be held in the City of San Diego on June 3, 1986 with the
Statewide Primary Election to be held on the same date, for the
purpose of amending the Charter of The City of San Diego.

2. The exact form of the propositions to be voted upon at
this Special Municipal Election and as they are to appear on the
ballot is as follows:

CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT AMENDING SECTION 11.1 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND ADDING SECTION 11.2.</p> <p>SECTION 11.1 LEGISLATIVE POWER - NONDELEGABLE.</p> <p>Imposes upon City Council same prohibition against delegating legislative power or responsibility as State Constitution imposes on the State Legislature regarding raising and spending public monies.</p> <p>Establishes guidelines for Council consideration in setting employee compensation.</p> <p>Requires City Council to give priority to police protection in setting compensation of City employees.</p> <p>Extends the prohibition against unlawful delegation to any scheme or formula which seeks to fix, establish or adjust the compensation of City of San Diego employees at the level of the largest cities in California or the State of California.</p>	<p>Y E S</p>	
<p>SECTION 11.2 LEGISLATIVE POWER - MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.</p> <p>Notwithstanding any provisions of this Charter to the contrary, nothing in this Charter shall be construed to preclude the Council from entering into a multiple year memorandum of understanding with any recognized City employee organization concerning wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment if, in the prudent exercise of legislative discretion as provided in this Charter, the Council determines it is in the best interests of the City to do so; and further provided that said exercise of legislative discretion is expressed affirmatively by a two-thirds vote of the entire Council.</p>	<p>N O</p>	

<p>PROPOSITION _____. INITIATIVE MEASURE. AMENDS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO BY ADDING SECTION 130.1.</p> <p>The Council shall establish, for fiscal year 1986-1987, a base salary for the classification of Police Officer II, which is not less than the average base salary for comparable police officer positions in the California Highway Patrol and the police departments of the four (4) largest cities by population in the State of California. In determining the average salaries, no California city will be considered if that city is required to use an averaging formula for determining police officer salaries. All other classifications in the police unit shall receive a percentage base salary increase equal to that for Police Officer II as determined in the above manner.</p> <p>The establishment of salaries for police classifications using the above formula for fiscal year 1986-1987 shall not require an increase in the annual tax levy.</p>	Y E S

The propositions shall be designated on the ballot by a letter printed on the left margin of the square containing the description of each measure as provided in Section 10219 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

3. That the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to canvass the returns of this Special Municipal Election and is requested to conduct the elections in all respects as if there were only one election using only one form of ballot.

4. That the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego is requested to issue to all officers of the County charged with duties pertaining to the Statewide Primary Election appropriate instructions to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of a consolidated election.

5. That the City Clerk of The City of San Diego is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County of San Diego shall be reimbursed in full for the services performed by the Registrar of Voters for the City of San Diego in connection with the election services herein described.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego agrees to indemnify and to save free and harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees from expense or liability, including reasonable attorneys fees, as the result of an election contest initiated pursuant to the provisions of Division 13 of the Elections Code of the State of California after conduct of these elections.
