RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 265191

ADOPTED ON MAR 4 1986

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN UNDERGROUND
UTILITY DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AND DENOMINATED
AS THE CORONADO AVENUE (MADDEN AVENUE TO BEYER
BOULEVARD) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. R-264942, a public hearing was called for on March 4, 1986 at the hour of 10:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Administration Building, 202 C Street, San Diego, California, to determine whether the public health, safety or general welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within that certain area of the City of San Diego more particularly described as follows:

The southerly 50 feet of Section 27, T 18 S, R 2 W between a line parallel to and 175 feet east of the easterly line of Madden Avenue, and a line parallel to and 225 feet east of the easterly line of Madden Avenue; the easterly 300 feet of Section 27, T 18 S, R 2 W, between a line parallel to and 400 feet south of the southerly line of Coronado Avenue, and the southerly line of Coronado Avenue; the easterly 37 feet of Section 26, T 18 W, R 2 W between a line parallel to and 475 feet north of the northerly line of Iris Avenue, and the northerly line of Iris Avenue; the easterly 100 feet of Section 35, T 18 S, R 2 W between a line

parallel to and 60 feet south of the southerly line of Iris Avenue, and the southerly line of Iris Avenue.

Said district shall also include the following described public rights-of-way:

CORONADO AVENUE between a line parallel to and 200 feet west of the westerly line of Madden Avenue and a line parallel to and 310 feet east of the easterly line of Beyer Boulevard; MADDEN AVENUE between a line parallel to and 50 feet north of the northerly line of Coronado Avenue and a line parallel to and 50 feet south of the southerly line of Coronado Avenue; 30TH STREET between a line parallel to and 100 feet south of the southerly line of Coronado Avenue and the southerly line of Coronado Avenue; BEYER BOULEVARD between the northerly line of Caulfield Drive and a line parallel to and 60 feet south of the southerly line of Iris Avenue; CAULFIELD DRIVE between the easterly line of Madden Avenue and the westerly line of Beyer Boulevard; IRIS AVENUE between a line parallel to and 100 feet west of the westerly line of Beyer Boulevard and the westerly line of Beyer Boulevard, all as more particularly shown on Drawing No. 22472-D entitled "CORONADO AVENUE (MADDEN AVENUE TO BEYER BOULEVARD) UNDERGROUND UTILITY DISTRICT," copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 264942 and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, notice of such hearing has been given by the City Clerk to all affected property owners as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and the utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, such hearing has been duly and regularly held and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

1. The City Council does hereby find and determine that the public health, safety and general welfare require the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service within the area set forth above and that pursuant to Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, the above-described area is hereby declared to be an underground utility district in the City of San Diego, and the maps and document referred to above are hereby incorporated as a part of this resolution.


2. The City Council shall by subsequent resolution fix the date upon which the property in the district must be ready to receive underground service, and shall by subsequent resolution order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service.

3. The City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify all affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code, and all affected utility companies of the adoption of this resolution within

fifteen (15) days after the date of such adoption. The City Clerk shall further notify said affected persons as defined in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code of the necessity that if they desire to continue to receive electric, communication, community antenna television or similar or associated service they shall provide at their own expense all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive underground service from the lines relocated underground of the supplying utility company subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility company on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California (as of the date of adoption of this resolution) and subject to all other applicable requirements of State law and City ordinances. The Clerk's notification shall be made in the manner provided in Chapter VI, Article 1, Division 5 of the San Diego Municipal Code.
