WHEREAS, there have been continuous problems of health hazards and water pollution caused by sewage discharge from the City of Tijuana, Mexico, crossing the border into the United States; and

WHEREAS, the problem of raw sewage discharges from the City of Tijuana into the United States is primarily a federal responsibility; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, Public Law 98-396 authorized \$32 million to address the sewage pollution problem and appropriated \$5 million for the initial planning and design of a defensive system; and

WHEREAS, the \$5 million appropriation is available only until September 30, 1986; and

WHEREAS, this \$5 million is currently being held by the Environmental Protection Agency; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of The City of San Diego, that the Environmental Protection Agency should release these monies to the International Water and Boundary Commission so that this appropriation can be encumbered and utilized to plan and design the next phase of the defensive system; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of San Diego's federal legislative delegation be encouraged to independently contact the Environmental Protection Agency in support of this resolution.
