RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 265616 ADOPTED ON MAY 05 1986

WHEREAS, in November of last year, the one year moratorium for offshore oil drilling off the coast of California ended and an extension of the moratorium was narrowly defeated in Congress by a one vote margin; and

WHEREAS, San Diego is now threatened with an environmental catastrophe of dramatic proportions; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors, San Diego
Association of Governments, and the cities of the region support
the prohibition of oil drilling within twenty-five miles of shore
and most local governments support a fifty-mile wide marine
sanctuary off San Diego's coast; and

WHEREAS, in the next few months, the process of opening up the waters off the Southern California coast to oil drilling will begin and oil companies will identify to the Department of the Interior those lease tracts they desire to drill; and

WHEREAS, after the oil companies have identified the prime tracts, the Department of the Interior will designate which lease tracts they intend to auction to the oil companies; and

WHEREAS, it is now deemed desirable to take all necessary actions to minimize the anticipated threat of offshore oil drilling along San Diego's precious coastline; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Planning Director be and he is hereby directed to examine

current zoning and development conditions along and near the City's coastal corridor with the intention of rezoning or modifying zones in those areas where onshore support facilities for offshore oil drilling could potentially be located.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that The City of San Diego's representatives to the Port Commission be directed to request a similar study of tidelands under the control of the Port District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Director of the Intergovernmental Relations Department be and he is hereby directed to work with the other cities and counties along the Southern California coast in an effort to encourage those cities and counties to adopt similar legislation and ballot measures in opposition to offshore oil drilling.
