BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council hereby approves and adopts the guidelines on waste-to-energy legislation and regulatory standards contained in City Manager Report No. 86-190, a copy of which Report is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-265807-/.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council hereby incorporates the recommendations stated in the April 21, 1986 memorandum from Councilwoman Judy McCarty to Rules Committee, a copy of which memorandum is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-265807.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby adopts the recommendations contained in the City Manager's memorandum dated May 23, 1986, a copy of which memorandum is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- $\frac{265807}{}$  as confirmed in Councilmember Abbe Wolfsheimer's memorandum dated May 27, 1986, a copy of which memorandum is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- $\frac{265807}{}$ , with the following provisos and modifications:

1. That the City Manager be and he is hereby directed to cause the formation of a health risk assessment board comprised of specialists from the fields of pharmacology, pulmonary medicine, cancer research, dermatology, teratogens, occupational health, environmental design, engineering and toxicology;

- 2. That the members of this board be nominated by the respective health care institutions designated in the above referenced memoranda, or in the absence of such nominations within a reasonable time as may be otherwise determined by the City Manager;
- 3. That the City Manager report to the Public Services and Safety Committee the results of the designation and development process to form this board;
- 4. That the health risk assessment board thereafter review, evaluate and make recommendations to the City Manager and the Council concerning a health risk assessment associated with the SANDER project, with appropriate participation and public discussion through the Quality of Life Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council hereby directs the Intergovernmental Relations Department to incorporate the following guidelines in Council Policy No. 000-19 (Legislative Policy Guidelines):

## XV. WASTE-TO-ENERGY POLICY

- A. It shall be the legislative policy of the Council to support:
  - 1. Legislation which establishes realistic and effective guidelines and requirements to protect the public health and safety as they apply to waste-to-energy. These guidelines should apply to all potential sources of pollutants and should not single out waste-to-energy facilities.
  - 2. Legislation that provides alternative funding approaches for waste-to-energy; funding for the study of alternative technologies and pilot programs; and funding for improvements in the emission and pollution control equipment for these facilities.

- 3. Efforts which will require waste-to-energy projects to address complete health risk assessments and make findings that there be no significant risk to public health associated with the project.
- 4. Efforts which will require waste-to-energy projects to maintain compliance during operation with applicable air pollution standards.
- B. It shall be the legislative policy of the Council to oppose:
  - 1. Legislation which arbitrarily forecloses alternative disposal or waste handling methods available to the City, County and other local jurisdictions. This includes moratoriums on waste-to-energy facilities, or any other standards or regulations which have the same effect, so as to delay indefinitely the permitting of such facilities in conformance with the City's position on home rule and local autonomy and authority to govern municipal affairs.
  - 2. Efforts which would unnecessarily delay possible solutions to waste disposal problems or which would prohibit waste-to-energy projects unless the prohibitions result from completed health studies which identify significant health risks.
