RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 266159

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE
SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF
SAN DIEGO ON JUNE 3, 1986.

WHEREAS, a Special Municipal Election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 3, 1986, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-16605 (New Series), adopted March 3, 1986, for the purpose of electing a mayor to fill the unexpired term of Roger Hedgecock; and

WHEREAS, a Special Municipal Election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 3, 1986 pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-16599 (New Series), adopted February 18, 1986, which Special Municipal Election was consolidated with the Statewide Primary Election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego two (2) propositions to amend the Charter of The City of San Diego as follows:

PROPOSITION E

<p>PROPOSITION E. CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHARTER AMENDMENT AMENDING SECTION 11.1 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND ADDING SECTION 11.2.</p> <p>SECTION 11.1. LEGISLATIVE POWER -- NONDELEGABLE.</p> <p>Imposes upon City Council same prohibition against delegating legislative power or responsibility as State Constitution imposes on the State Legislature regarding raising and spending public monies.</p> <p>Establishes guidelines for Council consideration in setting employee compensation.</p> <p>Requires City Council to give priority to police protection in setting compensation of City employees.</p> <p>Extends the prohibition against unlawful delegation to any scheme or formula which seeks to fix, establish or adjust the compensation of City of San Diego employees at the level of the largest cities in California or the State of California.</p>	<p>Y E S</p>	
<p>SECTION 11.2. LEGISLATIVE POWER - MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING.</p> <p>Notwithstanding any provisions of this Charter to the contrary, nothing in this Charter shall be construed to preclude the Council from entering into a multiple year memorandum of understanding with any recognized City employee organization concerning wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment if, in the prudent exercise of legislative discretion as provided in this Charter, the Council determines it is in the best interests of the City to do so; and further provided that said exercise of legislative discretion is expressed affirmatively by a two-thirds vote of the entire Council.</p>	<p>N O</p>	

PROPOSITION F

<p>PROPOSITION F. INITIATIVE MEASURE. AMENDS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO BY ADDING SECTION 130.1.</p>	<p>Y E S</p>	
<p>The Council shall establish, for fiscal year 1986-1987, a base salary for the classification of Police Officer II, which is not less than the average base salary for comparable police officer positions in the California Highway Patrol and the police departments of the four (4) largest cities by population in the State of California. In determining the average salaries, no California city will be considered if that city is required to use an averaging formula for determining police officer salaries. All other classifications in the police unit shall receive a percentage base salary increase equal to that for Police Officer II as determined in the above manner.</p> <p>The establishment of salaries for police classifications using the above formula for fiscal year 1986-1987 shall not require an increase in the annual tax levy.</p>		<p>N O</p>

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of Voters of San Diego County canvassing the returns of the special municipal election, as certified to the City Clerk, has been duly received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of these elections has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council;
NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

I

The whole number of votes cast in the City was 212,781.

II

The total vote received by each municipal candidate at the special municipal election is as follows:

A. FOR OFFICE OF THE MAYOR (unexpired term):

MAUREEN O'CONNOR	112,308
BILL CLEATOR	90,811
MERRILL COHEN	28
ROBERT E. McCULLOUGH	24

MAUREEN O'CONNOR having received a majority of all votes cast is hereby declared elected to the office of Mayor.

III

The number of votes cast in the City for and against each of the two propositions which appeared on the ballot as Propositions E and F and the total number of votes cast upon each such proposition are as follows:

PROPOSITION E

For	99,634
Against	59,541
TOTAL	159,175

Proposition E received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on it and such proposition is hereby declared to have been approved.

PROPOSITION F

For	63,848
Against	98,518
TOTAL	162,366

Proposition F did not receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on it and such proposition is hereby declared to have failed.

IV

The number of votes in each precinct cast for each person and for and against each measure are recorded in the Election Returns Book, which book is a part of the records of this Council.

V

The City Clerk shall make public the results of the canvass of the general municipal election by publication of a copy of this resolution.
