AN EMERGENCY MEASURE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. O-16780 (NEW SERIES) BY AMENDING SECTION 1. TO PROVIDE FOR A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR THE DEMOLITION OR REMOVAL OF EXISTING BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES WITHIN THE SHERMAN HEIGHTS NEIGHBORHOOD OF THE SOUTHEAST COMMUNITY PLAN AREA WHICH SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON ITS ENACTMENT.

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego, under the police power delegated to it by the Constitution of the State of California, has the authority to act to protect and promote the public health, safety and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has approved and adopted the Project First Class Urban Design Study which proposes that The City of San Diego initiate a historic district nomination of the Sherman Heights Neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has allocated funds to the Planning Department for the conduct of a historical survey of buildings and structures within the Sherman Heights Neighborhood, bounded on the west by Interstate 5, on the north by State Route 94, on the east by 25th Street, and on the south by Imperial Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Historical Site Board will utilize said historical survey in a determination of whether to designate the area as a historic district, pursuant to the requirements of San Diego Municipal Code Section 26.02; and

WHEREAS, the Sherman Heights Neighborhood Element of the draft revision of the Southeast San Diego Community Plan calls for the protection, preservation, and enhancement of buildings and structures of architectural and historical significance which help to define the cultural and developmental character of the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, there are no existing restrictions on the potential demolition and/or removal of the buildings and structures being surveyed, before they can be considered by the Historical Site Board; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of San Diego Municipal Code Section 101.0205.2 provide that in the event the City Council initiates a change of zone, the City Council may adopt an ordinance providing that no development inconsistent with the provisions of the most restrictive zone under consideration shall take place pending a determination by the City Council of the proposed change of zone; such ordinance may be adopted only if the City Council finds that development inconsistent with the proposed change of zone would be detrimental to the public health, safety, general welfare and good zoning practice and that such development appears imminent; and

WHEREAS, on December 9, 1986, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. O-16780 (New Series), which placed zoning and development restrictions on various neighborhoods of the Southeast San Diego planning area in order to avoid compromising the implementation of the Southeast San Diego Community Plan; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the City Council that an emergency situation exists within the Sherman Heights

Neighborhood, with respect to the possible precipitous demolition and/or removal of historic and architecturally significant buildings and structures; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that there is a current and immediate threat to the public's health, safety and general welfare, and that the issuance of any permits for either the demolition and/or removal of buildings and structures in the Sherman Heights Neighborhood would conflict with an ongoing City Council initiated study of the area and with the goals and objectives of the City Council adopted Project First Class Urban Design Study and the draft Southeast San Diego Community Plan; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the following provision is adopted as an emergency measure amending Ordinance No. O-16780 (New Series) by amending Section 1. to read as follows:

Section 1. Within that area known as Sherman Heights and generally bounded by State Route 94 on the north, Interstate 5 on the west, 25th Street on the east and Imperial Avenue on the south, and shown more specifically on Map No. C-729; that all property presently zoned R-1000 and CC (Community Commercial) shall not be developed with more than one dwelling unit per 5,000 square feet of parcel area unless a Planned Residential Development Permit or a Conditional Use Permit is obtained. Within the area described above, no permit shall be issued for

the demolition and/or removal of any buildings or structures.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to the following:

- A. To any building or structure found by the City Manager of The City of San Diego to present a hazard to public health or safety, and for which an emergency permit for demolition must be issued; or
- B. To any permit approved by the Planning
 Director, Planning Commission or City Council as part of
 a development project submitted, reviewed and approved
 in accordance with this ordinance, and provided that
 such development application includes an environmental
 document prepared in accordance with the California
 Environmental Quality Act which describes and addresses
 the historic/architectural significance of the property
 and such report is reviewed by the Historical Site Board
 for the purpose of recommending to the Planning Director
 whether the proposed project should be approved,
 modified or denied based on the importance of the
 existing building(s) or structure(s) and their
 likelihood to contribute to the significance of the
 proposed Sherman Heights Historic District.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its introduction and adoption.

AN EMERGENCY MEASURE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 0.16780 (NEW SERIES) BY AMENDING SECTION 1. TO PRO-VIDE FOR A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR THE DEMOLITON OR REMOVAL OF EXISTING BUILD-INGS AND STRUCTURES WITHIN THE SHERMAN HEIGHTS NEIGHBORHOOD OF THE SOUTHEAST COMMUNITY PLANARE WHICH SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON ITS ENACTMENT.

This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 0-16780 (New Series) by imposing an additional limitation which prohibits the demolition or removal of buildings or structures, without first obtaining a discretionary permit, within the area known as Sherman Heights. Sherman Heights is an area generally bounded on the west by Interstate 5, on the north by State Route 94, on the east by 25th Street, and on the south by imperial Avenue. Becuase this ordinance is an emergency riesaure, it becomes effective upon its introduction and adoption.
