ORDINANCE NUMBER 0-16877 (NEW SERIES)

ADOPTED ON JUNE 22, 1987

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 6, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 56.54 RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS.

WHEREAS, a San Diego Police Department city-wide survey of alcohol consumption problem areas revealed a need to expand the downtown restricted area from the easterly boundary of 12th Avenue to the easterly boundary of Interstate Highway 5; and

WHEREAS, a San Diego Police Department city-wide survey of alcohol consumption problem areas revealed certain discrepancies in the addresses of locations listed in section 56.54(b) of the San Diego Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, there has been an increase in alcohol-related criminal activities and aggressive and/or offensive conduct by persons frequenting the below-listed areas; and

WHEREAS, many citizens of the City of San Diego fear to take their families to said areas for fear of harassment and/or violence; and

WHEREAS, it has been the experience of other coastal communities that prohibition of alcohol at their beaches results in a decrease in undesirable behavior; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter V, Article 6, section 56.54 of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 56.54 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person without a permit duly issued by the City Manager for a special event to consume any alcoholic beverage, as defined in California Business and Professions Code, section 23004, upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, plaza, or in any public park within the following limits of the City of San Diego:

Starting at the intersection of Martin
Luther King, Jr. Way (formerly Market
Street) and Pacific Highway and
proceeding northerly on Pacific Highway
to its intersection with Ash Street; then
easterly on Ash Street to its
intersection with the easterly boundary
of 11th Avenue; then southerly along the
easterly boundary of 11th Avenue to the
northerly boundary of Russ Boulevard;
then easterly along the northerly
boundary of Russ Boulevard to the
easterly boundary of Interstate Highway
5; then southerly on the easterly

boundary of Interstate Highway 5 to its intersection with Imperial Avenue; then westerly on Imperial Avenue to Harbor Drive; then northwesterly on Harbor Drive to Pacific Highway; and then northerly along Pacific Highway to the point of beginning.

The area described above shall include all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to persons consuming alcoholic beverages within the defined boundaries of a sidewalk cafe located on the public right-of-way. A sidewalk cafe is defined in Section 101.0550.

- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person without a permit duly issued by the City Manager for a special event to consume or to possess an open container of any alcoholic beverage, as defined in Business and Professions Code section 23004, in the following areas of The City of San Diego:
 - (1) All public parking lots within Mission Bay Park;
 - (2) the West parking lot of the Jetty at 600 Block San Diego Place;
 - (3) the parking areas around The Plunge and Belmont Park Roller Coaster at 3000

to 3200 Block Ocean Front Walk, 3000 to 3200 Block Mission Boulevard and 700 Block Ventura Place;

- (4) the La Jolla Shores parking lot at 8300 Block Camino del Oro;
- (5) the 600 Block Tourmaline Street.

The public parking lots at the following locations:

- (6) The 2400 Block Bacon Street, including the area commonly known as Robb Field;
- (7) the 5200 Block Voltaire Street;
- (8) the 5200 Block Brighton Street;
- (9) the 5000 Block Newport Avenue, including the parking area at the foot of Newport Avenue;
- (10) the 1900 Block Abbott Street;
- (11) the 1100 to 1300 Block Sunset Cliffs Boulevard;
- (12) the 4400 Block Ladera Street;
- (13) the 2400 to 2500 Block Sunset Cliffs Boulevard.

The area described above shall include all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
