RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION, THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON NOVEMBER 3, 1987.

WHEREAS, a general municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, November, 3, 1987, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-16912 (New Series), for the purpose of electing candidates; and

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on the same date pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-16914 (New Series) adopted July 28, 1987, which special municipal election was consolidated with the general municipal election for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of San Diego six (6) propositions, one proposition to amend the Charter of The City of San Diego by adding Charter Section 55.1; one proposition relating to changing the appropriations limit for the fiscal years 1988 through 1991; one proposition relating to an initiative measure to repeal San Diego City Council Resolution R-265534 and to irrevocably rename the affected street as Market Street; one proposition relating to an initiative measure adopting an ordinance to restrict the use of Mission Beach Park; one proposition relating to an initiative measure amending the City of San Diego Progress Guide and General Plan to add solid waste incineration standards to the energy

conservation element guidelines and standards; one proposition relating to amending the City of San Diego Progress Guide and General Plan to redesignate certain parcels of land from "future urbanizing" to "planned urbanizing" as follows:

PROPOSITION D

PROPOSITION D. AMENDS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO BY ADDING SECTION 55.1.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Charter to the contrary, the total land and water area of all leases in Mission Bay Park shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total dedicated land area or six and one-half percent (6.5%) of the total dedicated water area respectively of the park without such lease being authorized or later ratified by vote of 2/3's of the qualified electors of the City voting at an election for such purpose.

- b. be located within a three mile radius of a hospital, elementary school, or child care center or nursing home for the elderly licensed by a governmental entity; or c. make additional demands on the treated water distribution system within the City.

  2. Any such facility built shall include recycling and separation methods whereby major sources of toxic air pollutants, including but not limited to plastics, metals, industrial wastes, and coatings, are removed from the solid waste prior to the incineration.
