ADOPTED ON MAR 221988

WHEREAS, Section 6 of the SAVE MISSION BEACH PARK (BELMONT PARK) initiative (Proposition G), enacted by the voters of the City of San Diego and effective as of November 4, 1987, recognizes the existence of vested rights and exempts any development project meeting standards specified therein; and

WHEREAS, supporters of the Giant Dipper, the Belmont Park roller coaster, have made application for exemption under Section 6 of Proposition G with respect to the Belmont Park Project; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 1988, the City duly noticed a public hearing for the purpose of receiving testimony and evidence with respect to said application for exemption; and

WHEREAS, on March 21, 1988, the City Council conducted a public hearing with respect to said application for exemption at which time the City Council received and considered evidence on the matter, both oral and written; and

WHEREAS, at said public hearing testimony and evidence was also submitted to the effect that the roller coaster had obtained a "vested right" to continue commercial operation by virtue of approximately 50 years of commercial operation on the site; and

WHEREAS, at said hearing testimony and evidence was also submitted to the effect that prior to the effective date of Proposition G the roller coaster had obtained its final discretionary approval for continuing commercial operation and

that substantial expenditures have been incurred in good faith reliance on the final discretionary approval and substantial construction has been performed on the property in good faith reliance on the discretionary approval; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, based upon the testimony and evidence submitted at said public hearing, the City Council of The City of San Diego hereby finds that:

- 1. The roller coaster has obtained a "vested right" to continue commercial operation as a result of approximately 50 years of commercial operation on the Belmont Park site prior to the effective date of Proposition G.
- 2. The roller coaster has obtained a "vested right" to continue commercial operation in that final discretionary approval for such operation has been obtained, substantial expenditures have been incurred on good faith reliance on such final discretionary approval, and substantial construction has been performed on the property in good faith reliance on the final discretionary approval.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in adopting this resolution the City Council hereby incorporates all of the testimony and documentary evidence submitted at said public hearing as its basis for the above findings.
