BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to execute, for and on behalf of said City, a letter agreement with the Board of Education, for transporting School Safety Patrol students to summer camp at the Palomar Mountain School Camp, during the period of June 27, 1988 through July 22, 1988, under the terms and conditions set forth in the letters attached as Attachments A and B.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the transportation of City employees and School Safety Patrol members is hereby specifically authorized under the condition that the City is obligated to share equally with the San Diego Unified School District liability in excess of School District's insurance policy limits of \$5 million arising out of the negligent acts of City employees or Safety Patrol students during said transportation.

Dear Tom:

The Police Department sponsored School Safety Patrol Summer Camp at Palomar County School Camp affords sixth grade boys and girls from all elementary schools an educational growth and recreational experience in one of the four one-week sessions. The selection and mixture of minority and majority schools has been, and will continue to be, deliberately scheduled to afford an ethnic balance in accordance with the integration goals of the San Diego City Schools.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for your cooperation in providing school bus transportation to and from the camp last year and, if possible, arrange for buses again this year.

This letter will serve as our tentative agreement on terms and conditions for transporting Safety Patrol students from June 27, 1988, through July 22, 1988, pending City Council approval. First: It is agreed that the Police Department will assume total responsibility for the conduct of students while riding the bus. The responsibility includes, but is not limited to, vandalism of school equipment, liability for damages resulting from objects thrown from the bus, and any medical expenses for an injury while entering, leaving, or moving about the bus. (Basic medical expenses are primarily covered by individual school camp insurance.) Second: An equal share of the liability over and above the insurance limitations involved will be assumed if the School District meets the following performance standards: 1. All Drivers are licensed in accordance with the Vehicle Code for transporting school students; 2. All buses are Class A rated, meeting all safety regulations prescribed in the Vehicle and Education Codes; and 3. That the School District's 5 million dollar insurance policy remain in effect.

It is requested that four, 70 passenger buses pick up students at one central location (San Diego Jack Murphy Stadium) on each of four consecutive Mondays at 8:00 a.m., and transport them directly to Palomar School Camp. The return trip will be on following Fridays. Buses should arrive at Camp Palomar in time to load and depart from the camp at 12:00 p.m. to transport students back to the Stadium. It is understood that the buses have limited baggage capacity and the Police Department will make arrangements to transport the students' luggage.

I am sure the students will have a memorable camp experience which will be enhanced by your cooperation in providing one of our most essential needs. A City Council resolution, ratifying this agreement, will be provided prior to the encampment.

Dear Bill,

Thank you for your recent letter regarding the San Diego Police Department-sponsored School Safety Patrol Summer Camp which has occurred in past years. This experience at Palomar County School Camp offers educational and recreational opportunity to all sixth-grade students who have served on school safety patrols in 1987-88. I am pleased to inform you that the school district will be able to support your efforts by providing bus transportation to and from the camp June 27, 1988 to July 22, 1988.

As specified in your letter of February 1, 1988, the school district will provide four 70-passenger buses to pick up students at San Diego Jack Murphy Stadium at 8:00 a.m. on June 27, July 4, July 11, and July 18. Buses will arrive at Camp Palomar at 12:30 p.m. to transport students back to the stadium on the following Fridays.

The terms and conditions of the agreement, as outlined in your letter, are acceptable to the school district. This includes Police Department responsibility for the conduct of students on the buses, and assumption by the City of San Diego of liability over and above insurance limitations provided by the school district. Performance requirements related to drivers and buses, as stated in your letter, will be enforced.
