ADOPTED ON MAY 31 1988

WHEREAS, the federal government, by the Comprehensive Crime
Control Act of 1984, has created provisions for equitable sharing
with state and local law enforcement agencies of assets seized
and forfeited for certain criminal violations; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego, by Resolution No. R-265036 adopted on February 10, 1986, authorized the City Manager to request, for and on behalf of the City, equitable transfer of forfeited property seized during operations which included participation by the San Diego Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has, through both adoptive seizures and joint investigations, caused a significant amount of assets to be subjected to federal forfeiture and intends to continue to emphasize this aspect of the law enforcement struggle against narcotics trafficking; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego, by Resolution No. R-265827 adopted on May 27, 1986 approved the City Managers recommendations as contained in Manager's Report No. 86-213 dated May 2, 1986, involving the use of up to twenty-five percent (25%) of the funds received from seized and forfeited assets to pay non-personnel costs of implementing drug and gang education programs of the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department desires to expend seized asset funds on the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Program which

is an in-school drug education awareness program for fifth and sixth grade students and on the Police Activities League (PAL) which is an Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) sanctioned athletic league administered by the Police Department in cooperation with local officials, business and community volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the executive board of the Mayor's Committee on Drug
Abuse has been briefed on these two proposals and unanimously
supports the concepts; NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to expend up to \$377,300 from Special Fund 10132, as such funds become available within the twenty-five percent (25%) authorized by Resolution No. R-265827 adopted on May 27, 1986, solely and exclusively for costs of implementing the Drug Abuse Resistance Education and Police Activities League programs as detailed in Manager's Report No. 88-85 issued January 29, 1988.
