Any allegation submitted for the consideration of the Commission shall be in writing and the truth thereof shall be attested to under penalty of perjury. Any such investigation or hearing shall be closed to the public and findings of the Commission shall be confidential and not available to the public except as otherwise provided by law. The Commission shall have the power to subpoena and require the attendance of witnesses and the production of books and papers pertinent to the investigation and to administer oaths to such witnesses. A determination shall be made by the Commission as to whether an allegation of Police misconduct was sustained or not sustained and such determination shall be forwarded to the Chief of Police and the City Manager. The Commission shall appoint an executive director and such investigators and other personnel as may be provided by the City Council. The executive director and Commission personnel shall be in the unclassified service notwithstanding any provisions in Section 117 to the contrary. Subject always to the requirement of confidentiality of its investigations, hearings and findings, the Commission shall periodically, but at least once a year, make a general report and hold a public hearing thereon to inform the public concerning its activities.
