WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego desires to form a parking and business improvement area to be known as "Mission Hills Business Improvement District" pursuant to the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1979 (Streets and Highways Code Section 36500, et seq.), in accordance with the wishes of the many businesses in the area; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The Council hereby declares its intention to form a parking and business improvement area to be known as "Mission Hills Business Improvement District" (the "District") pursuant to the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1979 (Streets and Highways Code Section 36500, et seq.).
- 2. The area to be included in the District includes the Mission Hills community area within the following address ranges:

- 3. The purpose of forming the aforementioned District as a parking and business improvement area under the aforementioned Business and Improvement Area Law is to provide revenue to defray the costs of services and programs which will benefit businesses in the area. The services and programs to be provided are those listed in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, and the services and programs listed thereon are the uses to which the revenue generated by the assessments to be levied will be put.
- 4. All businesses operating in the above-described area will be assessed a share of the costs of the aforementioned services and programs according to the type of business and the benefit to be received as determined by the following:
 - A. Description of the District Zones:
 - 1. ZONE 1 is Fort Stockton Drive on the north, University Avenue on the south, Albatross Street on the east and Jackdaw Street on the west.

Businesses in this area will receive the greatest benefit from the promotional activities of the District.

- 2. ZONE 2 is the surrounding area including
 West Lewis Street, India Street and Reynard Way.
 It is anticipated that businesses in this Zone will
 still receive a benefit, but not of the same
 magnitude as those in the core area of the Mission
 Hills business district.
- B. Description of the District Categories of Benefit:
 - 1. CATEGORY A includes those businesses which will benefit most significantly from the increased awareness of Mission Hills as a place to do business and from an increase in foot and automobile traffic expected to be the end-product of the promotional activities of the District. The Category includes but is not limited to:

3. CATEGORY C includes those businesses which interact with the public to a lesser extent than CATEGORIES A or B, and are predominately service related. CATEGORY C also includes apartments of six (6) units or more. The Category includes but is not limited to:

- 4. Businesses not specifically identified in CATEGORIES A, B or C shall be categorized by the City Treasurer upon application for a City general business tax certificate.
- C. The assessment to be imposed for those District businesses by Zone and Category of Benefit are as follows:

The above-described assessment is an annual charge and shall be levied, collected and enforced in the same manner, at the same time, and with the same penalties and interest as in the case of the general business tax. For those businesses taxed for other than an annual tax period, the City Treasurer shall determine the assessment to be levied upon issuance of the City business tax certificate.

The total assessment collected from any business under the provisions of the ordinance shall not exceed \$90.00 per annum.




