AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER X, ARTICLE 1, DIVISION 6, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 101.0630 RELATING TO SATELLITE ANTENNAS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter X, Article 1, Division 6, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Section 101.0630, to read as follows:

SEC. 101.0630 SATELLITE ANTENNA

Satellite antennas, as defined in

Section 101.0101.94, are permitted in all zones as
accessory uses. If the satellite antenna is generally
circular and reflective and has a diameter (or its
equivalent) of less than five (5) feet, the antenna is
not subject to these requirements. A satellite
antenna, which has this element, which exceeds the
equivalent of a diameter of five (5) feet but has the
equivalent of a diameter of less than ten (10) feet, is
permitted in all zones subject to the provisions of
this section and the provisions of the underlying zone.
Satellite antennas are permitted by right in industrial
and Scientific Research (SR) zones as accessory uses,
subject to yard provisions, except when located in the

Coastal Zone or 200 feet from residential zone designation.

Any deviations from the following regulations may be permitted by a Satellite Antenna Permit in accordance with Section 101.0502.

- A. Satellite antennas shall be accessory uses of the property in both residential and commercial zones.
- B. Satellite antennas shall be ground mounted or roof mounted in residential and commercial zones. Roof mounted antennas shall comply with Development Guidelines outlined in Document No. RR-274882
- C. Satellite antennas shall not be permitted on properties which have been designated as historic sites.
- D. Satellite antennas shall be located in the rear forty percent (40%) of lots.
- E. Satellite antennas shall comply with minimum yard requirements of the underlying zone.
- F. Ground mounted satellite antenna height shall not exceed fifteen (15) feet in height measured from existing grade.
- G. Ground and roof mounted satellite antennas must be screened by fencing buildings or landscaping so that not more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the antenna height is visible from grade level of adjacent public property and rights-of-way.

- H. Satellite antennas shall not be located in the Hillside Review Overlay Zone.
- I. Satellite antennas shall not be light reflective. Satellite antennas shall not have any copy on them nor shall they be illuminated. Satellite antennas shall blend into their surrounding environment.
- J. Roof mounted antennas and pole mounted antennas which extend to the roof must be screened by recessing the antenna into the roof line or by constructing a screen out of similarly textured roofing or exterior wall material. Roof mounted antennas located on flat roofs shall be screened by a wall or parapet.
- K. Roof mounted satellite antennas must be similar in color and tone to the roofing material. Mesh antennas are preferred over solid antennas.
- The total height of the structure and the satellite antenna must not exceed the height limit (as defined in Section 101.0101.62) of the underlying zone.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage, however, the provisions of this ordinance shall not be applicable within the Coastal Zone until the thirtieth day following the date the California Coastal Commission unconditionally certifies this ordinance as a local coastal program amendment. If this ordinance is not certified, or is certified with suggested modifications by the California Coastal Commission, the provisions of this ordinance shall be null and void within the Coastal Zone.

Section 3. In areas of the City of San Diego other than the Coastal Zone no permits for development inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be issued unless application therefore was made prior to the date of adoption of this ordinance.

Section 4. Within the Coastal Zone no permits for development inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be issued unless application therefore was made prior to the date the California Coastal Commission unconditionally certified this ordinance as a local coastal program amendment.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER X ARTICLE 1, DIVE SION 8, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMEN-DING SECION 101.0630 RELATING TO SATELLITE ANTEN-

This ordinance modifies the regulations applicable to satellite antennas. Antennas less than five feet in diameter are not regulated. Antennas five feet of more and less than 10 Feet in diameter are permitted subject to specified location and development regulations. Antennas that do not meet the provisions of the ordinance may be permitted by Satellite Antenna Permit in accordance with Municipal Code section 101.0502.
