BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The Council hereby declares its intention to form a parking and business improvement area to be known as "La Jolla Business Improvement District" (the "District") pursuant to the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1989 (Streets and Highways Code Section 36500, et seq.).
- 2. The area to be included in the District includes the La Jolla community area within the following address ranges:

- 4. All businesses operating in the above-described area will be annually assessed a share of the costs of the improvements and activities according to the type of business and the benefit to be received as determined by the following:

- A. Description of the District Zones:
- 1. ZONE 1 is along Prospect Street and Coastal Boulevard south, and portion of Fay Avenue and Girard Avenue. Businesses in this area will receive the greatest benefit from the activities of the District.
- 2. ZONE 2 is the surrounding area including Silverado Street, Ivanhoe Avenue, Herschel Avenue, Torrey Pines Road, Wall Street, Pearl Street, Kline Street, Silver Street and La Jolla Boulevard. It is anticipated that businesses in this Zone will still receive a benefit, but not of the same magnitude as those in the core area of the La Jolla business District.

- 4. Businesses not specifically identified in CATEGORIES A, B, or C shall be categorized by the City Treasurer based on the appropriate PBAC upon the application from the City business tax certificate.
- C. Except where funds are otherwise available, an assessment will be levied annually to pay all improvements and activities within the area. The assessments to be imposed for those District Businesses by Zone and Category of Benefit are as follows:

The above-described assessment is an annual charge on all businesses including those new to the area and shall be levied, collected and enforced in the same manner, at the same time, and with the same penalties and interest as in the case of the business tax.

The total assessment collected from any business under the provisions of the ordinance shall not exceed \$350 per annum.
