RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING THE REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS STATEMENT ESTABLISHED BY THE SAN DIEGO ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS.

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego and the San Diego Association of Governments adopted the existing Regional Housing Needs Statement for the period 1985 to 1990, which recommended the regional share and "fair share" of housing needs; and

WHEREAS, the existing Regional Housing Needs Statement relied upon the 1980 Census, Series 6 Regional Growth Forecasts, and other information available at that time; and

WHEREAS, the effective period of the Regional Housing Needs Statement (1985-1990) is about to lapse and the jurisdictions in the San Diego Region are submitting revised housing elements for review and comment by the State Department of Housing and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, the state housing law requires each jurisdiction to identify its share of the region's housing need as part of its housing element and to avoid the concentration of lower income households; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Association of Governments has proposed revisions to the Regional Housing Needs Statement for 1991-1996 which uses updates to the 1980 Census, Series 7 Regional Growth Forecasts, and other information currently available; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of the revised Regional Housing Needs Statement would provide a step in a locally developed method of addressing housing needs of all households; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. The above recitations are true and correct.
- 2. The City of San Diego recognizes the Regional Housing
  Needs Statement as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto for
  use in The City of San Diego housing element revisions.
- 3. The City of San Diego hereby adopts its regional share of 43,802 units and its "fair share" of 42.9 percent and a five-year goal to assist 9,316 lower income households.

#### REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS STATEMENT

#### Introduction

California state law requires the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) ... to prepare, once every five years, the Regional Housing Needs Statement for use in local housing elements. The Regional Housing Needs Statement identifies each jurisdiction's share of the region's total need for new housing units (regional share) and the need for assistance for lower income households ("fair share"). The Housing Needs Statement is based upon the approved Regional Growth Forecasts.

Local housing element revisions, according to state requirements, are due by July 1, 1991.

#### RECOMMENDATION

that the Board of Directors of the San Diego Association of Governments accept the Regional Housing Needs Statement for distribution to local, state, and federal agencies and local housing interest groups for review and comment.


#### Discussion

Jurisdictions, in responding to state law, must include in their housing elements their share of the regional need for new housing units and their share of lower income households, both existing and new, who need assistance (fair share). Once the needs are assessed and local policies established, the jurisdictions develop housing programs to meet the existing and projected housing needs of households of all income groups.

The Regional Housing Needs Statement (RHNS) contains a thorough analysis of the region's housing. However, two important categories of need are emphasized in the RHNS and the attached tables identify these needs for each jurisdiction.

Regional Share - The regional share identifies the number of new housing units that each jurisdiction should provide. These numbers are divided into four income groups: very low (income not exceeding 50% of the region's median income), low (income between 50% and 80%), moderate (80% to 120%), and above moderate (more than 120%). Table 1 identifies the housing needs that each jurisdiction must address in their revised housing elements. (Table 1 attached.)

• Fair Share - Fair share identifies the number of existing and new lower income households that each jurisdiction should assist for the five-year period of the housing element. The distribution of these needs must by law avoid further concentration of lower income households in those jurisdictions with relatively high proportions of such households. Fair share requirements are identified through application of the regional housing allocation formula which was first adopted by SANDAG in 1979 and updated in 1984. (Table 2 attached.)
