RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON JUNE 5, 1990.

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in the City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 5, 1990, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-17438 (New Series), adopted March 7, 1990, which Special Municipal Election was called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of The City of San Diego (3) propositions: One proposition to amend Section 4 and 12 of the Charter of The City of San Diego pertaining to the number of Council districts (Proposition B); one proposition to amend Section 5 of the Charter of The City of San Diego to establish a one-time waiver of the four-year limit on redistricting (Proposition C); and, an ordinance changing the appropriations limit for fiscal years 1992 through 1995 (Proposition D), as follows:

PROPOSITION D. AN ORDINANCE OF THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO CHANGING THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL YEARS 1992 THROUGH 1995. Shall The City of San Diego's appropriations limit for Fiscal Year 1992 provided for in Article XIIIB YES of the California Constitution be revised upward to \$592,000,000 (an increase of \$273 million) provided this limit is adjusted each year for Fiscal Years 1992-93, 1993-94 and 1994-95 for changes in population and cost of living as provided by the State Constitution NO to permit the expenditure of anticipated revenues from existing sources and sources to be authorized to fund needed programs which include, but are not necessarily limited to, police protection, fire protection, refuse collection and disposal, library services, park and recreation programs, and facility and infrastructure maintenance and capital improvements?

PROPOSITION D

Against	68,296
TOTAL	170,886

Proposition D received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have been approved.
