## ORDINANCE NUMBER 0-17663 (NEW SERIES) ADOPTED ON JUL 151991

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 6, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING SECTION 56.29 AND AMENDING SECTION 56.54, BANNING OR RESTRICTING ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION OR POSSESSION OF OPEN CONTAINERS IN CERTAIN AREAS OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO.

WHEREAS, excessive noise, acts of vandalism, rowdy behavior and violence in certain parts of the beach areas have been occurring and are known to be related to the consumption and abuse of alcohol; and

WHEREAS, on June 10, 1991 the San Diego City Council held public hearings and heard testimony regarding excessive noise, rowdiness, reckless, violent and dangerous behavior as a result of excessive use and abuse of alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Police Department has researched incidents of violence and alcohol-related problems in the beach areas and has provided written reports and tables of reported crime and alcohol-related arrest data, which are on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 00-17655-1; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, Article 6, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and it is hereby amended by repealing Section 56.29.

Section 2. That Chapter V, Article 6, of the San Diego Municipal Code is hereby amended by amending Section 56.54, to read as follows:

## SEC. 56.54 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS

- (a) Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following terms are defined as follows:
- (1) "Alcoholic beverage" has the same meaning as that set forth in California Business and Professions Code section 23004.
- (2) "Open container" means any bottle, can or other receptacle containing any alcoholic beverage, which has been opened, or on which a seal has been broken, or the contents of which have been partially removed.
- (3) "Sidewalk cafe" has the same meaning as that set forth in San Diego Municipal Code section 101.0550.
- (b) Consumption of Alcoholic Beverage Prohibited.

  Unless the City Manager has issued a related special event permit, it is unlawful for any person to consume any alcoholic beverage at any time, upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, plaza or any public park within the following limits of The City of San Diego, including all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas:

From the intersection of Market Street and Pacific Highway and proceeding northerly on Pacific Highway to its intersection with Ash Street; easterly on Ash Street to its intersection with the easterly boundary of 11th

Avenue; southerly along the easterly boundary of 11th Avenue to the northerly boundary of Russ Boulevard; easterly along the northerly boundary of Russ Boulevard to the easterly boundary of Interstate Highway 5; southerly on the easterly boundary of Interstate Highway 5 to its intersection with Imperial Avenue; westerly on Imperial Avenue to Harbor Drive; northwesterly on Harbor Drive to Pacific Highway; and northerly along Pacific Highway to the point of beginning.

- (c) Consumption and Possession of Open Container of Alcoholic Beverage Prohibited. Unless the City Manager has issued a related special event permit, it is unlawful for any person to consume or to possess an open container of any alcoholic beverage at any time except as noted hereafter, in the following areas of The City of San Diego:
- (1) all public parking lots within Mission Bay Park;
- (2) the west parking lot of the jetty at the 600 Block of San Diego Place;
- (3) the parking areas around The Plunge and Belmont Park Roller Coaster at the 3000 to 3200 Block of Mission Boulevard and the 700 Block of Ventura Place;
- (4) the La Jolla Shores parking lot at the 8300 Block of Camino del Oro;
  - (5) the 600 Block of Tourmaline Street;
- (6) the public rights-of-way located between Mission Boulevard on the east, Ocean Front Walk on the

west, the South Mission Beach Jetty on the south, and Loring Street on the north;

- (7) the oceanfront boardwalk commencing at Ocean Beach Pier, and proceeding northward to the permanent Ocean Beach lifeguard station;
- (8) the oceanfront boardwalk commencing at the South Mission Beach Jetty northward to the southern boundary of Palisades Park, excluding Crystal Pier;
  - (9) the beach at La Jolla Shores;
- (10) the following parks and the public rightsof-way within or immediately adjacent to them:
  - (A) Kellogg Park;
  - (B) Pacific Beach Park;
  - (C) Mission Beach Park;
  - (D) South Mission Beach Park;
  - (E) Ocean Beach Park;
- (F) North Park Community Park and its inset parking area;
- (11) the public parking lots and all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of the lots at the following locations:
- (A) the 2400 Block of Bacon Street, including the area commonly known as Robb Field;
  - (B) the 5200 Block of Voltaire Street;
  - (C) the 5200 Block of Brighton Street;
- (D) the 5000 Block of Newport Avenue, including the parking area at the foot of Newport Avenue;
  - (E) the 1900 Block of Abbott Street;

- (F) the 1100 to 1300 Block of Sunset Cliffs Boulevard;
  - (G) the 4400 Block of Ladera Street;
- (H) the 2400 to 2500 Block of Sunset Cliffs Boulevard;
- (12) all oceanfront beaches from the southern boundary of Sunset Cliffs Park north to the southern boundary of Torrey Pines State Beach from the hours of eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. to eight o'clock (8:00) a.m.;
- (13) Ocean Beach Fishing Pier, from the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight to six o'clock (6:00) a.m.;
- (14) Fiesta Island and all public beaches and public recreation areas within Mission Bay Park from the hours of ten o'clock (10:00) p.m. to six o'clock (6:00) a.m.

The areas set forth in subsections (c)(6), (7), (8), (9), (12) and (13) are particularized in maps on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. 00-17655-2.

- (d) Exceptions. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
- (1) persons consuming alcoholic beverages within the defined boundaries of a sidewalk cafe located on the public right-of-way;
- (2) any business which is lawfully selling or dispensing alcoholic beverages in accordance with the requirements of local and state law.

(e) This section does not make punishable any act or acts which are prohibited by any law of the State of California.

Section 3. That Ordinance No. 0-17655 (New Series), adopted as an emergency ordinance on June 10, 1991, be and it is hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

- SEC. 56.54 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS
- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person without a permit duly issued by the City Manager for a special event to consume any alcoholic beverage, as defined in California Business and Professions Code, Section 23004, upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, plaza, or in any public park within the following limits of The City of San Diego:
- (a) Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following terms are defined as follows:
- (1) "Alcoholic beverage" has the same meaning as that set forth in California Business and Professions Code section 23004.
- (2) "Open container" means any bottle, can or other receptacle containing any alcoholic beverage, which has been opened, or on which a seal has been broken, or

the contents of which have been partially removed.

- (3) "Sidewalk cafe" has the same meaning as that set forth in San Diego Municipal Code section 101.0550.
- (b) Consumption of Alcoholic Beverage Prohibited.

  Unless the City Manager has issued a related special event permit, it is unlawful for any person to consume any alcoholic beverage at any time, upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, plaza or any public park within the following limits of The City of San Diego, including all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas:

Starting at From the intersection of Market Street and Pacific Highway and proceeding northerly on Pacific Highway to its intersection with Ash Street; then easterly on Ash Street to its intersection with the easterly boundary of 11th Avenue; then southerly along the easterly boundary of 11th Avenue to the northerly boundary of Russ Boulevard; then easterly along the northerly boundary of Russ Boulevard to the easterly boundary of Interstate Highway 5; then southerly on the easterly boundary of Interstate Highway 5 to its intersection with Imperial Avenue; then westerly on Imperial Avenue to Harbor Drive; then northwesterly on Harbor Drive to Pacific Highway; and then northerly along Pacific Highway to the point of beginning.

The area described above shall include all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to persons consuming alcoholic beverages within the defined boundaries of a sidewalk cafe located on the public right-of-way. A sidewalk cafe is defined in Section 101.0550.

(c) Consumption and Possession of Open Container of Alcohol Prohibited. Unless the City Manager has issued a related special event permit, it shall be is unlawful for any person without a permit duly issued by the City Manager for a special event to consume or to possess an open container of any alcoholic beverage, as defined in Business and Professions Code section 23004, at any time except as noted hereafter, in the following areas of The City of San Diego:

(1) The "beach area" starting at Ratkay Point and proceeding northerly along the waterfront of the Pacific Ocean and waters of Mission Bay to the northerly boundary of the Mission Bay channel entrance between the hours from twelve o'clock midnight and six o'clock a.m., and the "beach area" starting at the northerly boundary of the Mission Bay channel entrance and proceeding northerly along the waterfront of the Pacific Ocean and waters of Mission Bay to the southerly limits of the City of Del Mar between the hours from ten o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.

"Beach area" means any beach or land and the waters
abutting or adjacent thereto within the limits of The
City of San Diego and of all lands owned or controlled by

the City adjoining the waterfront of the Pacific Ocean and the waters of Mission Bay.

"Beach area" includes the Ocean Beach Fishing Pier,
Torrey Pines State Beach and any public area, boardwalk
and public right-of-way such as exists along Ocean Front
Walk extending up to the boundaries of adjacent property
owners including fences and walls maintained under
Encroachment Removal Agreements.

- (2) Fiesta Island and all public-beaches and public recreation areas within Mission Bay Park between the hours from ten o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.;
- (3 1) all public parking lots within Mission Bay Park;
- (4 2) the west parking lot of the Fjetty at the 600 Block of San Diego Place;
- (5 3) the parking areas around The Plunge and Belmont Park Roller Coaster at the 3000 to 3200 Block of Mission Boulevard and the 700 Block of Ventura Place;
- (6 4) the La Jolla Shores parking lot at the 8300 of Block Camino del Oro;
  - (7 5) the 600 Block of Tourmaline Street;
- (8) La Jolla Shores Beach and boardwalk,

  Kellogg Park and adjacent public parking lot from August

  1, 1990 through February 1, 1991;
- (6) the public rights-of-way located between Mission Boulevard on the east, Ocean Front Walk on the west, the South Mission Beach Jetty on the south, and Loring Street on the north;

- (7) the oceanfront boardwalk commencing at Ocean Beach Pier, and proceeding northward to the permanent Ocean Beach lifeguard station;

- (10) the following parks and the public rightsof-way within or immediately adjacent to them:

- including the parking area at the foot of Newport Avenue;
- (<del>15</del> F) the 1100 to 1300 Block of Sunset

Cliffs Boulevard;

(16 G) the 4400 Block of Ladera Street;

(17 H) the 2400 to 2500 Block of Sunset Cliffs Boulevard.

The area above shall include all sidewalks along the outer perimeter of such areas.

- (12) all oceanfront beaches from the southern boundary of Sunset Cliffs Park north to the southern boundary of Torrey Pines State Beach from the hours of eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. to eight o'clock (8:00) a.m.;
- (13) Ocean Beach Fishing Pier, from the hours of twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight to six o'clock (6:00) a.m.;
- (14) Fiesta Island and all public beaches and public recreation areas within Mission Bay Park between from the hours from of ten o'clock (10:00) p.m. and to six (6:00) a.m.

The ordinance amends the San Diego Municipal Code by repealing anobeolete, alcohol prohibition section and amending the current alcohol restriction section by prohibiting consumption or possession of open containers of alcohol from 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. along most occanifority beaches, and instituting the same restrictions at all times at La Jolia Shores beach and certain other City parks and beach areas.
