AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 9.5, DIVISION 5, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 59.5.0502 BY ADDING A SUBSECTION G RELATING TO LEAF BLOWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter V, Article 9.5, Division 5, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Section 59.5.0502 by adding subsection G., to read as follows:

SEC. 59.5.0502 DISTURBING, EXCESSIVE, OFFENSIVE NOISES - DECLARATION OF CERTAIN ACTS CONSTITUTING

The following activities, among others, are declared to cause disturbing, excessive or offensive noises in violation of this section and are unlawful, namely:

- A. through F. [No changes to these subsections]
- G. Leaf Blowers
- 1. A "leaf blower" means any portable, hand-held or back pack, engine powered device with a nozzle that creates a directable airstream which is capable of and intended for moving leaves and light materials.
- 2. No person shall operate a leaf blower in any residential zoned area between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8 a.m. on weekdays and 5 p.m. and 9 a.m. on weekends or on legal holidays specified in section 21.04 of this Code.

3. After (the effective date of this ordinance) and through June 30, 1993, no person may operate any leaf blower at a sound level in excess of 70 decibels measured at a distance of 50 feet or greater from the point of noise origin. Beginning on July 1, 1993, no person may operate any leaf blower at a sound level in excess of 65 decibels measured at a distance of 50 feet or greater from the point of noise origin.

4. Beginning on July 1, 1993, leaf blowers shall be equipped with functional mufflers and an approved sound limiting device required to ensure that the leaf blower is not capable of generating a sound level exceeding any limit prescribed in this section.

5. All litter and debris generated by leaf blower operation shall be cleaned up and disposed of in accordance with Chapter IV, Article 4, of this Code.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to insert the effective date of this ordinance in section 59.5.0502(g)(3) and remove the brackets.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

AM ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V. ARTICLE 9.5 DVI-MBION 5, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 59.5.0602 BY ADDING A SUBSECTION G RELATING TO LEAF BLOWERS.

This ordinance amends section 59.5.0502 of the San Diego Municipal Dode by adding subsection G dealing with the noise levels for operation of leaf; blowers. The subsection defines leaf, blowers and prescribes an operating noise level of 70 decibils through June 30, 1993, and 65 decibils threather, measured at a distance of 50 feet or greater from the point of noise origin. On or after July 1, 1993, leaf blowers must be equipped with hunctional mutilers and sound limiting devices necessary to ensure compliance with prescribed noise limits. All litter and debris is required to be cleaned up.
