AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER III, ARTICLE 5, DIVISION 1, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 35.0123 RELATING TO TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAXES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter III, Article 5, Division 1, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by amending Section 35.0123, to read as follows:

SEC. 35.0123 ACTIONS TO COLLECT TAXES AND ENFORCEMENT OF LIENS

- (a) [No change in text.]
- (b) Recording of a Certificate of Lien. If any amount required to be paid to the City under this Article is not paid when due, the City Treasurer may record in the office of the San Diego County Recorder a certificate which specifies the amount of tax and penalties due, the name and address of the operator liable for the same, a statement that the City Treasurer has complied with all provisions of this Article in the determination of the amount required to be paid and a legal description of the real property owned by the operator. From the time of the recording of the certificate, the amount required to be paid together with penalties constitutes a lien upon all real

property in the county owned by the operator or thereafter acquired before the lien expires. The lien has the force, effect and priority of a tax lien and shall continue for ten (10) years from the filing of the certificate unless sooner released or otherwise discharged.

(c) - (d) [No change in text.]

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.
