RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON NOVEMBER 6, 1990.

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in The City of San Diego on Tuesday, November 6, 1990, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-17516 (New Series), adopted August 7, 1990, which Special Municipal Election was called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of The City of San Diego eight (8) propositions:

One proposition to amend section 4 of the Charter of The City of San Diego (Proposition F); one proposition amending Charter section 12 (Proposition G); one proposition amending Charter section 92 (Proposition H); one proposition amending Charter section 141 (Proposition J); one proposition amending Charter section 143.1 (Proposition K); one proposition amending the Charter by adding section 221 (Proposition L); one proposition relating to an initiative measure adopting an amendment to The City of San Diego progress and General Plan pertaining to Traffic Control and Growth Management (Proposition M); and one proposition relating to an advisory vote financing library construction and maintenance costs (Proposition N), as follows:

Proposition M did not receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have failed.

PROPOSITION N

For 149,546

Against 96,803

TOTAL 246,349

Proposition N received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have been approved.
